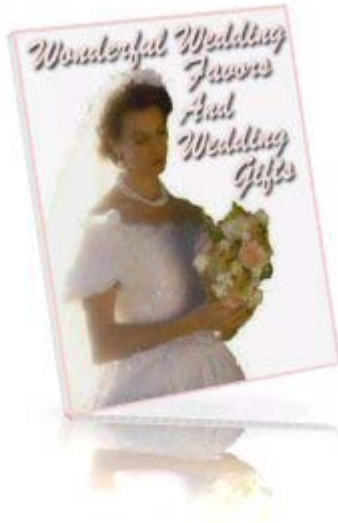


Wonderful Wedding Favors And Wedding Gifts

Following you will find patterns for bridal sachets that can be shared with your guests and bridesmaids.

Filled with lovely scented potpourri, they make wonderfully fragranced gifts or favors that are sure to please for many years.

Heart Sachet One



"STAR" PEARL COTTON Article 90, size 5-2 balls Nile Green, 2 balls Light Peach, steel 7 or "SILLATEEN SANSIL" Article 102-1 ball Nile Green, 1 ball Peach, steel 10 or "STAR" RAYON CROCHET Article 700-1 ball Baby Green, 1 ball Buttercup, steel 7 Cotton for filling.

Starting at upper section of sachet bag, with Green ch 10, sc in 2nd st from hook, 1 sc in each of the next 3 sts of ch, 1 sc, ch 3, 1 sc in next st of ch (center), 1 sc in each of the 4 remaining sts of ch, ch 5 to turn all rows.

2nd Row. 2 sc in 1st sc (increase), 1 sc in each of the next 4 sc, 1 sc, ch 3, 1 sc in center loop, 1 sc in each of the next 4 sc, 2 sc in last s c.

3rd Row. 2 sc in 1st sc, 1 sc in each of the next 6 sc, 1 sc, ch 3, 1 sc in center loop, 1 sc in each of the next 6 sc, 2 sc in last s c.

4th and 5th Rows. Work in same manner as 3rd row increasing 1 sc at beginning and end of each row, working 1 sc, ch 3, 1 sc in center loop of each row.

6th, 7th & 8th Rows. Decrease 1 sc at beginning of row (to decrease: * insert hook in next st, pull loop through, repeat from * once, thread over and pull through all loops at one time), 1 sc in each of the next 11 sc, 1 sc, ch 3, 1 sc in center loop, 1 sc in each of the next Use, decrease in last 2 s c.

9th & 10th Rows. Decrease 2 sc at beginning and end of each row working 1 sc, ch 3, 1 sc in each center loop.

11th Row. Decrease 1 sc, * ch 3, 1 sc in each of the next 2 sc, repeat from * 3 times, ch 3, 1 sc in next sc, 1 sc, ch 3, 1 sc in center loop, 1 sc in next sc, * ch 3, 1 sc in each of the next 2 sc, repeat from * 3 times, ch 3, decrease in next 2 sts, cut thread.

With Peach or Buttercup work another section in same manner.

EDGE: Place the 2 sections so that loops along edges correspond and work edging over both loops as follows: with Peach or Buttercup section toward you, attach Green in last sc of 1st row, * ch 5, d c in next loop, repeat from * all around ending with sl st at opposite end of 1st row, ch 1, turn.

2nd Row. * Work 5 sc in next ch 5 loop, repeat from * all around, ending with sl st at beginning of row, cut thread, do not turn.

3rd Row. Attach Peach or Buttercup in 1st sc, * ch 7, skip 1 sc, sc in next sc, repeat from * all around ending row with ch 7, sc in sl st, cut thread, do not turn.

4th Row. Attach Green in same space as last row, * ch 7, sc in next loop, repeat from * all around, ending row with ch 7, sl st in last st, cut thread, do not turn.

5th Row. Attach Peach or Buttercup in center st of 1st loop, ** ch 1, tr c in next loop, * ch 3, sc in 3rd st from hook for picot, ch 1, tr c in same loop, repeat from * 4 times, ch 1, sc in next loop, repeat from ** all around, cut thread.

FINISHING: Fill heart with cotton batting and sachet powder, sew opening closed. If desired, another bag may be made reversing the colors. If desired, lace ribbon through loops and tie in bow.

Victorian Sachet



COATS & CLARK'S O.N.T. TATTING-CROCHET, Art. C.21, Size 70: 1 ball of No. 1 White. Milwards Steel Crochet Hook No. 14. 8 bone rings, 1/2 inch in diameter . . . Blue satin for pillow.

FIRST MOTIF . . . Starting at center, ch 8. 1st rnd: In 8th ch from hook make (dc, ch 5) 3 times. Join with sl st in 3rd ch of ch-8.

2nd rnd: Ch 1, working over bone ring make 12 sc in each ch-5 sp around. Join to first sc.

3rd rnd: Ch 5, holding back on hook the last loop of each d tr, skip first sc, d tr in next 3 sc, thread over and draw through all loops on hook (cluster made), * ch 5, sl st in 3rd ch from hook (picot made), ch 8, picot in 3rd ch from hook, ch 2, make a 4-d tr cluster over next 4 sc.

Repeat from * around. Join last ch-2 to top of first cluster (12 clusters). Break off.

SECOND MOTIF . . . Work as for First Motif until 2 rnds have been completed.

3rd rnd: Ch 5, make a 3-d tr cluster over next 3 sc, (ch 2, picot, ch 2, sl st in center of any loop on First Motif, ch 2, picot, ch 2, make cluster over next 4 sc) twice; complete rnd as for First Motif (no more joinings).

Make 2 more motifs, joining them to first 2 motifs as before, leaving 1 loop free at center between motifs (this forms a square).

CORNER MOTIF . . . Work as for First Motif until 2 rnds have been completed.

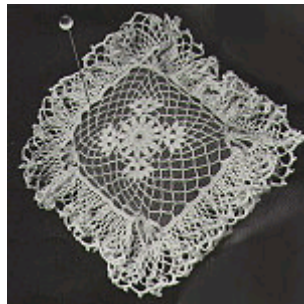
3rd rnd: Ch 5, make 3-d tr cluster over next 3 sc, ch 3, sl st in 4th picot preceding joining between motifs on square, * ch 1, sl st in 3rd ch of ch-3, thus joining picot, ch 6, sl st in next picot, ch 1, sl st in 5th ch of ch-6, ch 2, 4-d tr cluster over next 4 sc, ch 3, sl st in next picot.

Repeat from * until 8 picots in all have been joined. Complete as for

First Motif. Make 3 more corner motifs, joining them to the square as First Corner Motif was joined.

Attach thread to any free loop at center, ch 5, holding back on hook the last loop of each d tr (make d tr in free loop of next motif) 3 times; thread over and draw through all loops on hook. Break off. Make satin pillow the same shape as motifs. Sew motifs to pillow.

Ruffle Sachet



Materials Required—AMERICAN THREAD COMPANY "STAR" MERCERIZED CROCHET COTTON 1 175-yd. Ball White, Size 50. Strip Material 12 x 5 inches. Cotton for Stuffing. Steel Crochet Hook No. 12.

Fold material in half, sew 1 long and 1 short end together, turn, stuff with cotton and sew other side.

COVER. Ch 8, join to form a ring, ch 1 and work 12 s c in ring, join in 1st s c.

2nd Row—Ch 4, 2 tr c in same space, * ch 1, 3 tr c in each s c, repeat from * all around, ch 1, join in 4th st of ch.

3rd Row—Sl st to ch 1, ch 4, * thread over twice, insert in same space, work off 2 loops twice, repeat from * twice, thread over and work off all loops at one time, ** ch 5, cluster st in next 1 ch loop, (cluster st: * thread over twice, insert in same space, work off 2 loops twice, repeat from * 3 times, thread over and work off all loops at one time) repeat from ** all around, ch 5, join in top of cluster st.

4th Row—Ch 5, s c in same space, 4 s c over 5 ch loop, * s c, ch 5, s c in next cluster st, 4 s c over next 5 ch loop, repeat from * all around, join.

5th Row—Sl st to loop, * work 3 cluster sts with ch 5 between each cluster st in same space, ch 3, s c in next loop, ch 5, s c in next loop, ch 3, repeat from * all around, join in cluster st.

6th Row—Sl st to loop, * 3 cluster sts with ch 5 between each cluster st in same space, ch 5, 3 cluster sts with ch 5 between each cluster st in next loop, ch 7, skip 1 loop, s c in next loop, ch 7, skip 1 loop, repeat from * all around, join in cluster st.

7th Row—Sl st to center of loop, s c over same loop and work 8 ch loops all around, ch 3, tr c in 1st s c. (This brings thread in correct position for next row.)

8th Row—Work a row of 9 ch loops, ch 4, tr c in tr c.

9th Row—Work a row of 10 ch loops, ch 4, tr c in tr c.

10th Row—Work a row of 11 ch loops, ch 5, tr c in tr c, break thread.

11th Row—Join thread in center st in corner loop, ** ch 10, s c in same space, * ch 20, s c in same space, repeat from * 4 times, ch 10, s c in same space, * ch 10, s c in next loop, repeat from * 5 times, ch 10, s c in center st in next corner loop, ch 10, s c in same space, * ch 20, s c in same space, repeat from * 4 times, ch 10, s c in same space, * ch 3, 7 s c over next loop, repeat from * 5 times, ch 3, s c in center st in next corner loop, repeat from **.

12th Row—Sl st to center of 10 ch loop, * ch 7, s c in next loop, repeat from * 5 times, s c in next loop, * ch 11, s c in next loop, repeat from * 5 times, s c in 10 ch loop at corner, * ch 7, s c in next loop, repeat from * 5 times, s c in center s c of next s c group, * ch 11, s c in center s c of next s c group, repeat from * 4 times, s c in next 10 ch loop at corner, then repeat from 1st * all around.

13th Row—* 7 s c over loop, 1 s c over next s c, repeat from * 5 times, 10 s c over each of the next 6 loops, then repeat from beginning all around.

14th Row—Working in back loop of st only, 1 s c in each s c, join.

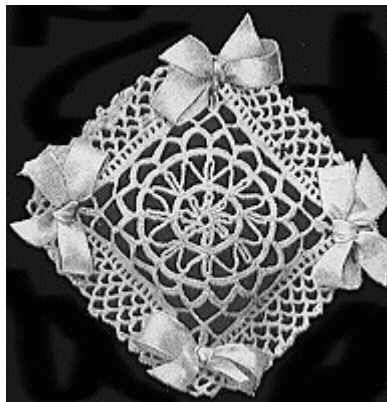
15th Row—Work a 6 ch loop in every other st, ch 2, tr r in 1st s c.

16th Row—Work a 7 ch loop in each loop, ch 3, tr c in tr c.

Next 3 Rows—Continue working loops increasing 1 ch in each loop of each row and ch 4, tr c in tr c at end of each row.

20th Row—S c over tr c, ch 5, sl st in s c for picot, 5 s c over same loop, * 6 s c over next loop, ch 5, sl st in last s c for picot, 5 s c over same loop, repeat from * all around, 5 s c over remainder of 1st loop, join, break thread.

Lovely Ladies Sachet



Ch 8; join to form ring.

1st Rd: * ch 10; 1 sc into ring; repeat from * 7 times.

2nd Rd: Sl st to center of 1st loop; * ch 6; 1 sc in center of next loop; repeat from *; join to 1st st.

3rd Rd: 6 sc in each space.

4th Rd: * 1 sc; ch 12; 1 so in same place as former st; ch 14; skip 5; 1 sc in next st; repeat from *; join at the end of row.

5th Rd: Sl st to center of 1st loop; * ch 6; 1 sc in center of next loop; repeat from * to end of row.

6th Rd: 6 sc in each space.

7th Rd: 1 sc; * ch 11; skip 5; 1 sc in next st; repeat from *.

8th Rd: 11 sc in each space.

9th Rd: Sl st 5 times; 1 so in next st; * ch 11; skip 10; 1 sc in next st; repeat from *; join.

10th Rd: Sl st 6 times. * 5 sc; 1 dc in next sc of previous row; 11 sc; 1 dc in next sc of previous row; 6 sc; ch 12; 1 sc in center of next space; ch 12; 1 sc in same place; ch 12; 1 sc in center of next space; repeat from *; join to 6th sl st at the beginning,

11th Rd: * 25 sc in sc of previous row; 6 sc in next 6 ch; ch 6; 1 sc in center of next space; ch 6; skip 1st 6 ch of following space; 6 sc; repeat from *.

12th Rd: Ch 4; skip 1 st; 1 dc in next st; * ch 2; skip 1 dc; repeat from * until corner is reached. Work 2 tr into this with 2 ch between them: repeat from *. Same for other corner.

13th Rd: 1 sc in 1st space; * ch 7; skip 2 dc; 1 sc in next space; repeat from *; join.

14th Rd: Sl st to center of 1st loop; 1 sc * ch 7; 1 sc in next loop; repeat from *.

15th Rd: Same as 14th.

16th Rd: Sl st to center of 1st loop; * ch 7; 1 sc in 5th ch from hook; ch 2; 1 sc in next loop; repeat from *. Join.

Pineapple Heart Sachet



Materials Required: AMERICAN THREAD COMPANY The Famous "PURITAN" CROCHET COTTON. Article 40 1 ball Tinted White Greens and Lavender Steel crochet hook No. 7 5 yds. 1 inch Light Green Ribbon 1/4 yd. Light Green material for Lining. Cotton for filling.

Ch 6, join to form a ring, ch 4, 2 tr c in ring, ch 3, 3 tr c in ring, ch 15, 3 tr c, ch 3, 3 tr c in ring, ch 6, turn.

2nd Row-3 tr c, ch 3, 3 tr c (shell) in ch 3 loop, ch 5, 19 s c over the the ch 15 loop, ch 5, 3 tr c, ch 3, 3 tr c in next ch 3 loop, ch 6, turn.

3rd Row-Shell in center of shell, ch 8, 1 tr c in 1st s c, * ch 1, skip 1 s c, tr c in next s c, repeat from * 8 times, ch 8, shell in center of next shell, ch 6, turn.

4th Row-Shell in center of shell, ch 8, s c in 1st tr c of pineapple, * s c in next ch 1 loop, s c in next tr c, repeat from * 8 times, ch 8, shell in center of shell, ch 6, turn.

5th Row-Shell in shell, ch 8, tr c in 1st s c, * ch 1, tr c in next s c, repeat *from 17 times, ch 8, shell in center of next shell, ch 6, turn.

6th Row-Shell in shell, ch 8, s c in 1st tr c of pineapple, * s c in next ch 1 loop, s c in next tr c, repeat from * 17 times, ch 8, shell in next shell, ch 6, turn.

7th Row-Shell in shell, ch 8, 5 c in 1st s c, * ch 5, skip 1 s c, s c in next s c, repeat from * 17 times, ch 8, shell in next shell, ch 6, turn.

8th Row-Shell in shell, ch 8, s c in 1st ch 5 loop of pineapple, * ch 5, s c in next loop, repeat from * 16 times, ch 8, shell in next shell, ch 6, turn. Repeat the last row 16 times, having 1 loop less in pineapple in each row until 1 loop remains, ch 6, turn.

Next Row-Shell in shell, ch 8, s c in remaining loop of pineapple, ch 8, 3 tr c in center of next shell, ch 1, turn, s c in center of last shell made, ch 1, turn, 3 tr c in same space to complete last shell, ch 6, turn, s c in some space where last 2 shells are joined, cut thread.

Work another section in same manner.

Cut lining same shape as sections but cutting $\frac{1}{4}$ inch larger all around than sections. Sew the 2 sections together leaving opening at top. Fill with cotton and sew remainder of cushion.

EDGE-Attach thread in any ch 6 loop and working through both sections, ch 4, 2 tr c, ch 3, 3 tr c in same space, ch 3, 3 tr c, ch 3, 3 tr c in next ch 6 loop, repeat from all around, inserting cushion after joining one side, ch 3, join in 4th st of ch.

Next Round-Sl st to center of shell, ch 6, tr c in same space, ch 2, tr c in same space, ch 2, tr c in same space, ch 3, s c in next loop, ch 3, 4 tr c with ch 2 between each tr c in Center of next shell, repeat from all around ending with ch 3, s c in next loop, ch 3, join in 4th st of ch.

Next Round~Ch 1, ** s c in next loop, *ch 4, sl st in 3rd st from hook for picot, ch 1, s c in next loop, repeat from * once, ch 4, s c in next s c, ch 4, skip 1 loop, repeat from ** all around ending to correspond, join, cut thread.

Trim with ribbon as follows: starting at top, place ribbon under the ch 8 loops around entire cushion having the wrong side of ribbon toward you, pull up a 2 inch loop between each ch, then holding cushion with

outside edge toward you working from back of loop, turn 1st loop of ribbon right side out and lay ribbon down toward the outside edge of cushion, pick up the next loop before it is turned and draw ribbon gently until 1st loop forms a point, continue forming a point in each loop of ribbon all around. Finish with ribbon rosette.

You're My Star Sachet



MATERIALS: CLARK'S O.N.T. "BRILLIANT," 1 ball. J. & P. COATS or CLARK'S O.N.T. SIX STRAND EMBROIDERY FLOSS, 1 skein of a contrasting color. Steel Crochet Hook No. 8. 1/2 yard of ribbon, 5/8 inch wide.

This amount is sufficient for 2 sachets.

Starting at center, ch 2. 1st rnd: 5 sc in 2nd ch from hook. Do not join rnds.

2nd rnd: 2 sc in each sc around (10 sts). 3rd rnd: * 2 sc in next sc (inc made), sc in next sc. Repeat from * around (15 sts). Now work sc in each sc around, increasing 5 sc on each rnd, until there are 35 sts in the rnd, sl st in next st. Do not break off but work points of star as follows: 1st row: Sc in next 8 sc. Ch 1, turn.

2nd and 3rd rows: Sc in each sc across. Ch 1, turn. Now dec 1 sc at beginning of each row until all sts are worked off--to dec an slc, work two sc as 1. Fasten off. Attach thread in same st where last sc of 1st row of previous point was made, sc in same place and in next 7 sc. Ch 1, turn and complete point as before. Make 3 more points.

Now embroider 5 long and 5 short lazy daisy stitches in the center and a horseshoe at each point as in illustration. Make another piece same as this. With wrong sides facing, place these pieces together, having corresponding parts over each other. Sew edges with neat over-and-over sts, stuffing with cotton batting with sachet powder between, before opening becomes too small. Cut a 5-inch length of ribbon. Double this piece, making a loop of it, and sew to a point (see illustration).

Heart Sachet Two



MATERIALS: CLARK'S O.N.T. "BRILLIANT," 1 ball each of 2 colors. Milward's Steel Crochet Hook No. 10. 1 yd. satin ribbon, 3/8 inch wide.

Sachet is made of two heart-shaped pieces, joined together with the ribbon.

Starting at top, with first color, wind thread 7 times around lower part of thumb. Remove from thumb (ring made), ch 3 and work 60 d c in ring; join. 1st row: S c in each of next 38 d c, ch 4, skip 2 d c, in next d c make 3 d c, ch 2 and 3 d c (a shell made). Ch 4, turn.

2nd row: In ch-2 sp of shell make 3 d c, ch 2 and 3 d c (shell over shell). Ch 1, skip 3 ch, s c in next ch, s c in each s c across (always pick up only the back loop of each s c throughout s c-section). Ch 4, skip 2 d c of ring, in next d c make a shell. Ch 1, turn.

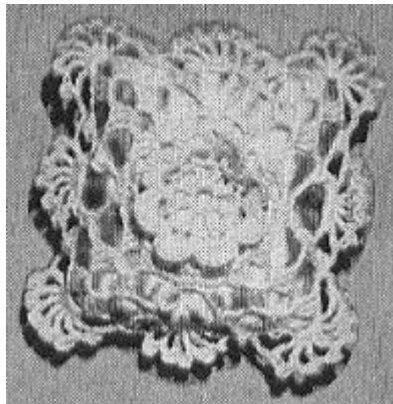
3rd and 4th rows: Shell over shell, ch 4, skip 3 ch, s c in next ch, s c in each s c across, s c in 1st ch of next ch-4, ch 1, shell over shell. Ch 4, turn.

5th to 9th rows incl: Shell over shell, ch 4, skip 1 s c, s c in each s c to within last s c, skip last s c, ch 4, shell over shell. Ch 4, turn.

10th row: Shell over shell, ch 4, skip 2 s c, s c in each s c across to within last 2 s c, ch 4, skip last 2 s c, shell over shell. Ch 4, turn. Repeat the 10th row until there are 16 shells on each side. Ch 4, sl st between last 2 s c of previous row. Fasten off. Sew together tips of last shells, with neat over-and-over stitches.

With second color make another piece same as this. Place one piece on top of the other. Pass ribbon through loops of both pieces in such a way as to have only the loops of the contrasting color appear on each side. Tie ribbon in a bow, and trim ends (see illustration). Stuff solid part with cotton, sprinkling sachet powder between layers of cotton, and sew top neatly.

Mini Victorian Pillow Sachet



TOP . . . Starting at center, ch 6. Join with sl st to form ring.

1st rnd: Ch 5, (dc in ring, ch 2) 7 times. Sl st in 3rd st of ch-5 (8 sps).

2nd rnd: Ch 1, sc in same place as sl st, * ch 4, sc in 3rd ch from hook (a ch-3 p made), ch 2, ch-3 p, ch 1, sc in next dc. Repeat from * around, ending with sl st in 1st sc made.

3rd rnd: Sl st in next 2 sts, sl st in loop (between p's), ch 3, in same loop make 2 dc, ch 5 and 3 dc; * ch 3, sc in next loop, ch 3, in next loop make 3 dc, ch 3 and 3 dc. Repeat from * around. Join last ch-3 to 3rd st of 1st ch-3.

4th rnd: Sl st in next 2 dc and in ch-5 loop, ch 3, in same loop make 2 dc, ch 5 and 3 dc; * ch 2, p, ch 2, sc in next sp, the following sc and in the next sp; ch 2, p, ch 2, in next ch-5 loop make 3 dc, ch 5 and 3 dc. Repeat from * around. Join.

5th rnd: Sl st in next 2 dc and in loop, ch 3, in same loop make 2 dc, ch 5 and 3 dc; * ch 2, p, ch 2, sc in next sp (preceding the p), ch 1, p, ch 2, p, ch 1, sc in next sp (following the p), ch 2, p, ch 2, in next loop make 3 dc, ch 5 and 3 dc. Repeat from * around. Join and fasten off.

Now work petals to form rosette as follows:

1st rnd: Attach thread to any ch-2 spot 1st rnd of Top, * ch 5, sc in next sp. Repeat from * around (8 loops).

2nd rnd: In each loop make sc, h dc, 5 dc, h dc and sc. Sl st in 1st sc. Fasten off.

Work under side of sachet cover same as top, omitting rosette at center. With satin make and stuff a sachet about 2¼ inches square. Place pieces with wrong sides together and join them by working over corresponding parts of both pieces as follows: Attach thread to corner loop (2 loops together), ch 7, sc in 3rd ch from hook, in same loop make 6 tr with p between, * ch 3, sc in next sp preceding the p's, ch 3, in next loop between p's make 6 tr with p between; ch 3, sc in next sp following the p's, ch 3, in next corner loop make 7 tr with p between. Repeat from * around, inserting sachet before opening becomes too small, complete rnd and fasten off.

Sweet Sunshine Sachet



MATERIALS: CLARK'S O.N.T. BEST SIX CORD MERCERIZED CROCHET, Art. B.4, Size 30: 1 ball of No. 9 Yellow. Milwards Steel Crochet Hook No. 10. 1/2 yard of narrow white lace. 1 yard of red grosgrain ribbon, 5/8 inch wide. Cotton and sachet. Piece of yellow material for lining.

Starting at back make a chain 2-1/2 inches long. 1st row: Dc in 4th ch from hook, dc in next 18 ch, 3 dc in next ch, dc in next 20 ch. Cut off remaining chain. Ch 3, turn.

2nd and 3rd rows: Skip first dc, dc in each dc across, dc in top of turning chain. Ch 3, turn.

4th to 10th rows incl: Dc in first dc (inc made), dc in each dc to within 1 dc of center dc, 2 dc in next dc, dc in center dc, 2 dc in next dc, dc in each remaining dc across, 2 dc in top of turning chain. Ch 3, turn,

11th to 16th rows incl: Holding back on hook the last loop of each dc make dc in next 4 dc, thread over and draw through all loops on hook (3 dc decreased), dc in each dc to within 1 dc of center dc, 2 dc in next dc, dc in center dc, 2 dc in next dc, dc in each remaining dc to within last 4 sts, work off last 4 sts as 1 dc. Ch 3, turn.

Break off at end of 16th row. Attach thread to side of end dc on first row, sc closely around three sides, ending at end dc on opposite side of first row. Ch 1, turn. Sc in each sc across. Break off.

Gather lace to fit around entire Bonnet. Sew in place. Cut lining material slightly larger than Bonnet. Turn under small hem and sew neatly to Bonnet, placing cotton and sachet between lining and Bonnet. Fold in half and sew up back. Trim with ribbon.

Heart Sachet Three



MATERIALS—Lily Knitting and Crochet Cotton Yarn, Art. 600, in Tea Rose and Cream (or other colors). Crochet hook size 0.

CENTER HEART—In Tea Rose, ch 2, making 1st st twice usual length, (1 sc, 1 hdc, 2 dc, 7 tr, 2 dc, 1 hdc and 1 sc) in long st.

ROW 2—Ch 1, turn, skip sc, 1 sc in next st, 2 sc in next, (2 hdc in next) twice, (2 dc in next) twice, 5 dc in next, (2 dc in next) twice, (2 hdc in next) twice, 2 sc in next, 1 sc in next, sl st in next.

ROW 3—Ch 1, turn, skip sl st, (sc in 2 sts, 2 sc in next) 3 times, hdc in 2 sts, dc in 2 sts, 5 dc in next st, dc in 2 sts, hdc in 2 sts, (2 sc in next st, sc in 2 sts) 3 times.

ROW 4—Ch 1, turn, skip last sc, sc in next 2 sc, 2 hdc in next st, (1 dc in next, 2 dc in next) 7 times, 3 dc in next st, (2 dc in next st, 1 dc in next) 7 times, 2 hdc in next st, sc in 2 sts, sl st in next.

ROW 5—Ch 1, turn, skip sl st, sc in 2 sts, hdc in 2 sts, (2 dc in next st, dc in 3 sts) 3 times, dc in 10 sts, 5 dc in next st, dc in 13 sts, (2 dc in next st, dc in 3 sts) twice, 2 dc in next st, hdc in 2 sts, sc in 2 sts. Fasten off.

EDGE—Join Cream down into center starting st, ch 5, sc up in 1st sc of last row, (ch 3, sc in next 2d st) 31 times, ch 2, sl st in 3d st of 5-ch.

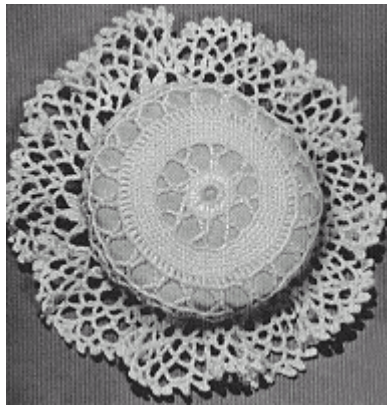
ROW 2—Ch 5, sc in next 3-ch loop, (ch 3, sc in next loop) 15 times, ch 5, sc in same loop, (ch 3, sc in next loop) 15 times, ch 2, sl st in 3d st of 5-ch.

ROW 3—(Ch 4, sc in next loop) around. Fasten off.

TRIM—In Cream, *ch 4, (3 dc, ch 3, sl st) in 4th ch st from hook.

Repeat from * twice. Sl st at base of 1st petal. Fasten off. Sew on 1st Row of Heart. Cut cardboard 1/4" smaller than Heart, cover back with cloth, pad front 1" high with cotton and cover with cloth. Tack to back of Heart. Fasten a ribbon bow at top with loop for hanging.

Round Victorian Sachet



Materials: Clark's O.N.T. "Brilliant", 1 ball. Milward's steel crochet hook No. 8. A pin cushion, 3¼ inches in diameter.

Starting at center, ch 10. Join with sl st to form ring. 1 st rnd: Ch 3, 23 dc in ring. Join with sl st to 3rd st of ch-3 first made.

2nd rnd: Ch 10, and complete a cross st as follows: Thread over twice, insert hook in 8th ch from hook, draw thread through (4 loops on hook), thread over once, skip 1 d c and insert hook in next d c, draw thread through (6 loops on hook), thread over and take off 2 loops at a time 5 times. * Ch 3, thread over 4 times, insert hook in next d c and draw thread through (6 loops on hook), thread over and take off 2 loops at a time twice; then thread over, skip 1 d c, insert hook in next d c, draw thread through (6 loops on hook), thread over and take off 2 loops at a time 5 times. Ch 3, d c in center point of cross, thus completing cross. Repeat from * until there are 8 cross sts around circle. Join last ch-3 with sl st to 7th st of ch-10.

3rd rnd: 5 s c in each ch-3 sp.

4th to 7th rnds incl: S c in each s c of previous rnd.

8th rnd: Ch 4, d c in 1st s c,* ch 1, d c in next s c. Repeat from * around. Then ch 1, join with sl st to 3rd st of ch-4.

9th rnd: Ch 10, and complete a cross st as before, skipping 2 d c between each leg of cross st and inserting hook in ch-1 sp; ch 3 and skip 2 d c between each cross st. Repeat around (20 cross sts) and join last ch-3 with sl st to 7th st of ch-10 first made.

10th rnd: Sl st in 1st 2 sts of 1st sp, ch 5, ** d c in same sp, ch 3, s c in next sp (between crosses), ch 3, d c in next sp, ch 2. Repeat from * to end of rnd. Join last ch-3 with sl st to 3rd st of ch-5 first made.

11th rnd: Ch 6, d c in 1st sp, ch 4, s c in next s c of previous rnd, ch 4, d c in next ch-2 sp, ch 3, d c in same sp. Repeat from * around, joining last ch-4 with sl st in 3rd st of ch-6 first made.

12th rnd: Ch 4 (to count as tr), 2 tr in 1st sp, holding back the last loop of each tr on hook, thread over hook and draw through all loops on hook, ch 1 to fasten (thus a 3-tr cluster is made); ch 5, 3 tr in same sp, holding back the last loop of each tr on hook, thread over and draw through all loops on hook, ch 1 to fasten (another 3-tr cluster), ch 5, 3-tr cluster in same sp, * ch 5, s c in sp between next 2 d c, ch 5; 3 clusters, with ch-5 between each cluster, in sp between next 2 d c. Repeat from * around. Join last ch-5 with sl st to tip of 1st cluster made.

13th rnd: * S c in next ch-5 loop, ch 5, s c in same loop, ch 5. Repeat from * around. Join with sl st.

14th and 15th rnds: Sl st to center of 1st ch 5 loop, * ch 5, s c in next loop. Repeat from* around. Join.

16th rnd: Sl st to center of 1st ch-5 loop, * ch 4, sl st in 3rd ch from hook (1 p made), ch 1, s c in same loop, ch 4, make another p, ch 1, s c in next loop. Repeat from * around. Join and break off.

Underside.

1st rnd: Attach thread in same sp as 3-cluster group on wrong side of work, ch 5, * s c in same sp as next cluster-group, ch 5. Repeat from * around. Join.

2nd rnd: Ch 5 (to count as d c and ch-2), * skip 2 sts, d c in next st, ch 2. Repeat from * around. Join last ch-2 with sl st to 3rd st of ch-5 first made.

3rd and 4th rnds: Ch 4, * d c in next ch-2 sp, ch 1. Repeat from * around. Join. Break off after 4th rnd. Cord. Make a chain about 14 inches long. Break off. Run cord through the last rnd of spaces. Insert pin cushion, and tie ends of cord.

Heart Sachet Four



MATERIALS: CLARK'S O.N.T. "BRILLIANT," 1 ball. Steel Crochet Hook No. 8. 1 yard of ribbon, 5/8 inch wide.

Starting at upper part of heart, ch 10. 1st row: Sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in next 3 ch; in next ch make sc, ch 3 and sc; sc in next 4 ch. Ch 5, turn.

2nd to 5th rows incl: 2 sc in 1st sc (an inc made), sc in each sc across to the ch-3. In ch-3 loop make sc, ch 3 and sc (2 more increases); sc in each sc across to last sc, 2 sc in last sc (another inc). Ch 5, turn.

6th, 7th and 8th rows: Work off 2 sc as 1 sc (a dec made); work across, increasing in ch-3 loop as before and decreasing an sc at end of row. Ch 5, turn.

9th and 10th rows: Work as before, decreasing 2 sc (instead of 1 sc) at both ends of row--to dec 2 sc, work off 2 sc as 1 sc twice. Ch 5, turn.

11th row: Dec 2 sc as before, * ch 3, sc in next 2 sc. Repeat from * across, making sc, ch 3 and sc in center ch-3 loop and decreasing 2 sc at end of row as before. Fasten off. Lay this piece aside. Make another piece same as this.

Place these 2 pieces so that loops along edges correspond, and work edging over both thicknesses as follows: 1st row: Attach thread to beginning of 1st row, * ch 5, dc in next double loop. Repeat from * across, ending with sl st at opposite end of 1st row. Ch 1, turn.

2nd row: 5 sc in each sp across, ending with sl st in same place where thread was attached. Ch 7, turn.

3rd row: *Skip 1 sc, sc in next sc, ch 7. Repeat from * across, ending row to correspond with beginning. Ch 7, turn.

4th row: * Sc in next loop, ch 7. Repeat from * across. Ch 7, turn.

5th row: * Sc in next loop, ch 1, in next loop make 6 tr with p between--to make a p, ch 3, sc in 3rd ch from hook--ch 1. Repeat from * across, ending row to correspond with beginning. Fasten off.

Sew edges of hearts together stuffing with cotton batting with sachet powder between, before opening becomes too small. Starting at top of heart with 1/2 yard of ribbon, pass ribbon through dc sps and tie a knot. Tie ends in a bow, 2 1/2 inches up from knot just made. Trim ends.

Lucky Leaf Sachet



MATERIALS: CLARK'S O.N.T. "BRILLIANT," 1 ball for each sachet. Steel crochet hook No.10. 1/4 yard ribbon, 5/8 inch wide. A piece of satin 3 x 6 inches

LEAF (Make 2)... Starting at Center, ch 35. 1st row: Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, ch 3, sc in same place as last sc; now working along opposite side of foundation ch, make sc in each ch across to last 4 sc, do not work in last 4 sts (this end is tip of leaf). Ch 5, turn. Hereafter work only in the back loop of each Sc.

2nd row: Sc in each sc across to the ch-3, in ch-3 loop make sc, ch 3 and sc (this end is base of leaf) ; Sc in each sc across to last 4 sc. Ch 5, turn. Repeat the 2nd row 8 more times. Now work sc in each sc across to ch-3 loop at base of leaf, sl st in loop. Fasten off.

Make another piece same as this. Place leaves together matching corresponding parts and sew along edges, leaving ch.5 loops free and stuffing with Cotton and sachet before opening becomes too small. Now work over corresponding loops of both leaves as follows: Attach thread to 1st 2 loops (one of each leaf), thus joining loops together, ch 3, dc in same place, ch 5, holding back on hook the last loop of each dc, make 2 dc in same place, thread over and draw through all loops on hook (cluster made), and continue making cluster, ch 5 and cluster in each set of corresponding loops along edge at tip of leaf. Fasten off.

Cut ribbon in half and run one piece through cluster edging at tip and tack ends to back. If desired ribbon rosebuds may be added. Form a loop with remainder of ribbon and fasten to base of leaf.

Summer Hat Sachet



MATERIALS: CLARK'S O.N.T. BEST SIX CORD MERCERIZED CROCHET, Art. B.4, Size 30: 1 ball of No. 8 Blue. Milwards Steel Crochet Hook No. 10. 1/2 yard of white satin ribbon, 1/4 inch wide. A few flowers. Piece of blue material for lining. Cotton and sachet.

CROWN . . . Starting at center, ch 2. 1st rnd: 8 sc in 2nd ch from hook. 2nd rnd: 2 sc in each sc around. 3rd rnd: Sc in each sc, increasing 8 sc evenly around—to inc 1 sc, make 2 sc in 1 sc. Repeat 3rd rnd until crown measures 1-1/8 inches in diameter. Join with sl st.

BEADING . . . Ch 5, * skip 1 sc, tr in next sc, ch 1. Repeat from * around. Join to 4th ch of ch-5.

BRIM ... 1st rnd: 2 sc in each ch-1 sp around. Join. 2nd rnd: Ch 3, dc in same place as sl st, * dc in next 2 sc, 2 dc in next sc. Repeat from * around. Join. 3rd to 9th rnds incl: Ch 3, dc in same place as sl st, dc in each dc increasing 14 dc evenly around —to inc 1 dc, make 2 dc in 1 dc. Join. Next rnd: Ch 1, sc in each dc around. Join and break off.

Stuff crown with cotton and sachet. Cut lining material slightly larger than brim of hat. Turn under small hem and sew lining to brim. Lace ribbon through Beading and tie into a bow. Sew flowers in place.

Heart Sachet Six



J. & P. COATS "KNIT-CRO-SHEEN" METALLIC, Art. A.64: 1 ball of No. M.76 Robinette. Milwards Steel Crochet Hook No. 6. 1/2 yard pink satin ribbon, 1/2 inch wide . . . A piece of pink satin.

Starting at top, ch 15. Join with sl st to form ring. 1st rnd: 40 sc closely in ring. Join to first sc.

Now work in rows as follows:

1st row- Ch 4, tr in front loop of next 19 sc. Ch 9, turn.

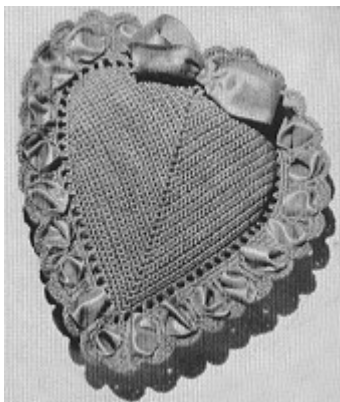
2nd row: In 6th ch from hook make 2 dc, ch 2 and 2 dc (shell made), ch 3, (tr in next tr, ch 1) 19 times; tr in top of starting chain. Ch 9, turn.

3rd row: Shell in 6th ch from hook, ch 4, sc in next ch-1 sp, (ch 3, sc in next sp) 18 times; ch 4, shell in sp of next shell (shell made over shell). Ch 5, turn.

4th row: Shell over shell, ch 4, sc in next ch-3 loop, (ch 3, sc in next loop) 17 times; ch 4, shell over shell. Ch 5, turn; work as for 4th row, having 1 ch-3 loop less on each row until 1 ch-3 loop remains. Ch 5, turn.

Next row: Shell over shell, ch 4, sc in next ch-3 loop, ch 4, shell over shell. Ch 5, turn. Following row: (Shell over shell) twice. Break off (one pineapple completed). Attach thread to free loop of first sc on ring and complete another pineapple the same way. Make a pin cushion slightly smaller than pineapple. Lace ribbon through ch-4 sps, inserting pin cushion, and tie into a bow at top.

Heart Sachet Seven



Materials: Clark's O.N.T. "Brilliant", 1 ball. Milward's steel crochet hook No. 10. A small heart-shaped pin cushion. 1/2 yd. ribbon, 5/8 inch wide.

Starting at top, ch 12.

1st row: S c in 2nd ch from hook, s c in each of next 5 ch, ch 3, s c in same ch where last s c was made, s c in each of next 5 ch. Ch 1, turn.

2nd to 11th rows incl: 2 s c in 1st s c (an increase), s c in each s c across to within ch-3 loop; in ch-3 loop make s c, ch 3, s c (2 more increases); s c in each s c across to within last s c, 2 s c in last s c (another increase). Ch 1, turn.

12th row: Same as 11th row, but omit increases at both ends of row. Ch 1, turn. 13th row: Same as 11th row.

14th to 21st rows incl: Repeat 12th and 13th rows alternately.

22nd to 27th rows incl: Same as 12th row, but dec. 1 s c at both ends of row (to dec. 1 s c, work off 2 s c as 1 s c). Ch 1, turn.

28th to 32nd rows incl: Same as 27th row, but dec. 2 s c (instead of 1 s c) at both ends of each row.

Hereafter work is done in rnds instead of rows, as follows:

1st rnd: S c closely together around to within ch-3 loop, sl st in loop.

2nd rnd: Ch 5 (to count as d c and ch-2), d c in loop, * ch 2. skip 1 s c, d c in next s c. Repeat from * around, ending rnd with ch 2, sl st in 3rd st of ch-5 first made.

3rd rnd: 3 sc in each sp around.

4th rnd: S c in each s c around. Join with sl st.

5th rnd: Ch 7 (to count as dtr and ch-2), *skip 1 s c, d tr in next s c, ch 2. Repeat from * to within 5 s c from center top s c, ch 2, skip 1 s c, tr in next s c, skip 1 s c, d c in next s c, skip 1 s c, s c in center top s c (thus completing half of rnd). Work other half of rnd to correspond, joining last ch-2 with sl st to 5th st of ch-7 first made.

6th rnd: * S c in next sp; in next sp make 5 d c with ch-1 between each d c; s c in next sp (1 shell made). Repeat from * around. Join with sl st. Fasten and break off.

Underside. Attach thread to any s c between d c's (on 1st row of spaces). 1st rnd: Ch 5 (to count as d c and ch-2), * d c in s c between next 2 d c's, ch 2. Repeat from * around, joining last ch-2 with sl st to 3rd st of ch-5 first made.

2nd and 3rd rnds: Sl st to center of 1st sp, ch 4 (to count as d c and ch-1), d c in next sp, ch 1. Repeat from * around. Join,

4th rnd: Ch 3, d c in each sp around. Join. 5th rnd: * Ch 5, skip 2 d c, s c in next d c. Repeat from * around. Fasten and break off.

Make a chain about 12 inches long, and pass it in and out through loops of last row of underside. Insert cushion, pull chain tight, and tie securely. Pass ribbon in and out tr-row, making a bow at center top.

This elegant shoe party favor is wonderful for holding tulle filled with birdseed or a few pieces of hard candy.

Shoe Party Favor



Materials Required: AMERICAN THREAD COMPANY The famous "PURITAN" STAR SPANGLED MERCERIZED CROCHET COTTON Article 40 1 Ball Silver Spangle or color of your choice. Steel crochet hook No. 7

Slipper mold measuring 1 1/2 inches at widest part of sole and measuring 3 5/8 inches from heel to toe.

STARTING AT HEEL: Chain (ch) 3, 9 double crochet (d c) in 3rd stitch (st) from hook, join in 3rd st of ch.

2nd Round. Ch 4, * d c in next d c, ch 1, repeat from * 8 times, join in 3rd st of ch.

3rd Round. Ch 4, d c in 1st ch 1 space, ch 1, * d c in next ch 1 space, ch 1, repeat from * 8 times, join in 3rd st of ch.

4th Round. Ch 4, d c in 1st ch 1 space, ch 1, * d c in next ch 1 space, ch 1, repeat from * 9 times, join in 3rd st of ch.

5th Round. Ch 4, d c in 1st ch 1 space, ch 1, * d c in next ch 1 space, ch 1, repeat from * 10 times, join in 3rd st of ch.

6th Round. Ch 4, d c in 1st ch 1 space, ch 1, * d c in next ch 1 space, ch 1, repeat from * 11 times, join in 3rd stitch.

7th Round. Ch 4, d c in 1st ch 1 space, ch 1, * d c in next ch 1 space, ch 1, repeat from * once, d c in next ch 1 space, * ch 2, d c in next ch space, repeat from * 9 times, ch 2, join in 3rd st of ch.

SOLE: 1st Row. Ch 5, d c in 1st ch 1 space, ch 2, * d c in next ch 1 space, ch 2, repeat from * once, skip next ch 1 space, d c in next d c, ch 5, turn.

Next 4 Rows. D c in 1st mesh, ch 2, * d c in next mesh, ch 2, repeat from * once, d c in 3rd St of ch, ch 5, turn.

6th Row. D c in 1st mesh, ch 2, * d c in next mesh, ch 2, repeat from * twice, d c in 3rd st of ch, ch 5, turn.

Next 2 Rows. D c in 1st mesh, ch 2, * d c in next mesh, ch 2, repeat from * 3 times, d c in 3rd st of ch, ch 5, turn.

9th Row. D c in 1st mesh, ch 2, * d c in next mesh, ch 2, repeat from * 4 times, d c in 3rd st of ch, ch 5, turn.

Next 3 Rows. Dc in 1st mesh, ch 2, * d c in next mesh, ch 2, repeat from * 4 times, d c in 3rd st of ch, ch 5, turn, ch 4 to turn on last row.

13th Row. D c in 1st mesh, ch 1, * d c in next mesh, Ch 1, repeat from * 4 times, ch 1, d c in 3rd st of sh, ch 2, turn.

14th Row. Short double crochet (s d c) in 1st ch 1 space (s d c: thread over hook, insert in st, pull loop through, thread over and work off all loops at one time, 1 s d c in each of the next 5 ch 1 spaces, s d c in 2nd St of ch, ch 1, turn.

15th Row. Insert hook in next s d c, pull loop through, repeat from beginning 6 times, thread over and work off all loops at one time, ch 2, do not turn.

TOP OF SLIPPER: 1st Round. D c over next ch 2 of 14th row, * ch 2, d c in next mesh, repeat from * all around ending with d c over s d c of 14th row, do not join this or following rounds, place a marker at beginning of each round.

2nd Round. Dc in next dc, ch 2, dc in next dc, ch 2, skip next mesh and next d c, * d c in next mesh, ch 2, repeat from * all around to within last 2 meshes, skip next mesh, 1 d c in next d c keeping last loop of st on hook, skip next mesh, center 2 d c and next mesh, 1 d c in next d c keeping last loop of st on hook, thread over and work off all loops at one time.

3rd Round. Ch 1, skip next mesh, * d c in next mesh, ch 2, repeat from * all around to within last 2 meshes, skip next mesh, d c in next d c, ch 1, d c in next d c keeping last loop of st on hook, skip next d c group, d c in next d c keeping last loop of st on hook, thread over and work off all loops at one time.

4th Round. 2 s c over last d c just made, 2 s c in each of the next 4 meshes, 1 s c in next mesh, * ch 2, d c in next mesh, repeat from * all around to within last 6 meshes, ch 2, s c in next mesh, 2 s c in each of the last 5 meshes, join, cut thread.

5th Round. Attach thread in 3rd mesh of last round, ch 2, * d c in next mesh, ch 2, repeat from * to within last 3 meshes, s c in next mesh, 2 s c in each of the last 2 meshes.

6th Round. 1 s c in each s c, 2 s c in each mesh, join, - cut thread.

DIRECTIONS FOR STARCHING: Dissolve 1/4 cup starch in 1/2 cup of cold water. Boil about 1 1/4 cups of water, remove from flame, then slowly stir the starch mixture into boiling water stirring constantly. Place back on flame until it thickens. As soon as starch is cool enough to handle, dip slipper, squeeze starch through it thoroughly. Wring out extra starch. The article should be wet with starch but there should be none in the spaces. Place over mold and let dry.

MATERIALS: J. & P. Coats Tatting-Crochet, Size 70: 1 ball each of No. 8 Blue, No. 9 Yellow and No. 48 Hunter's Green, or J. & P. Coats or Clark's O.N.T. Best Six Cord Mercerized Crochet, Size 30:

SMALL BALL: J. & P. COATS—1 ball each of No. 8 Blue, No. 9 Yellow and No. 26-B Bright Nile Green, or CLARK'S O.N.T.—1 ball each of No. 8 Blue, No. 9 Yellow and No. 48 Hunter's Green, or J. & P. Coats Big Ball Best Six Cord Mercerized Crochet, Size 30: 1 ball each of No. 8 Blue, No. 9 Yellow and No. 48 Hunter's Green, or Clark's Big Ball Three Cord Mercerized Crochet, Size 30: 1 ball each of No. 8 Blue, No. 9 Yellow and No. 48 Hunter's Green. Milwards Steel Crochet Hook No. 13 for Size 70; No. 10 for Size 30. 2/3 yard black velvet ribbon, 3/8 inch wide. 20 rhinestones. 1 pair earring backs. 2 snap fasteners.

NECKLACE—Flower (Make 11) . . . Starting at center with Blue, ch 8. Join with sl st to form ring.

FIRST PETAL . . . 1st row: 4 sc in ring. Ch 3, turn. 2nd row: Skip first sc, dc in next 3 sc, Ch 3, turn. 3rd row: Skip first dc, holding back on hook the last loop of each dc make dc in next 2 dc and in top of turning chain, thread over and draw through all loops on hook (cluster made); ch 3, sl st in tip of cluster. Now, working along side of petal,

(ch 3, sl st in base of next row) twice; sl st in ring. Make 4 more Petals like this. Join and break off.

CENTER . . . With Yellow, ch 6. Join with sl st to form ring. 12 sc in ring. Join and break off. Sew Center to flower.

STEM (Make 10) . . . Using Green double make a chain 1½ inches long.

Starch flowers lightly and press. Cut a piece of velvet ribbon 15½ inches long. Make a ½ inch hem on each end. Sew flowers evenly spaced to ribbon. Sew Stems between flowers. Sew a rhinestone to Center of each Flower. Sew snap fastener in place on each end.

BRACELET . . . Make 5 Flowers and 4 Stems as before. Sew to remaining piece of ribbon in same manner.

EARRING (Make 2) . . . Make 2 Flowers as before. Paste to Earring back.

Bridal Garter



MATERIALS: J. & P. Coats or Clark's O.N.T. Pearl Cotton, Size 5: 2 balls of No. 1 White and 1 ball of No. 48 Hunter's Green, or J. & P. Coats "Knit-Cro-Sheen": 1 ball each of No. 1 White and No. 48 Hunter's Green, and J. & P. Coats or Clark's O.N.T. Best Six Cord Mercerized Crochet, Size 30:

SMALL BALL: J. & P. COATS—1 ball of No. 9 Yellow, or CLARK'S O.N.T.—1 ball of No. 9 Yellow, or J. & P. Coats Big Ball Best Six Cord Mercerized Crochet, Size 30: 1 ball of No. 9 Yellow, or Clark's

Big Ball Three Cord Mercerized Crochet, Size 30: 1 ball of No. 9 Yellow. Milwards Steel Crochet Hooks No. 7 and 10. A bridal garter.

GLADIOLA (Make 3) . . . Starting at center with White, ch 10. Join with sl st to form a ring.

FIRST PETAL . . . 1st rnd: Ch 10, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in next ch, half dc in next ch, dc in next 4 ch, half dc in next 2 ch, sc in ring. Make 5 more Petals in same manner. Break off.

2nd rnd: Work around Petal as follows: * Holding back on hook the last loop of each dc, make a dc in next 3 sts, thread over and draw through all loops on hook (2 dc decreased), dc in next 2 sts, half dc in next 2 sts, sc in next 2 sts, at tip make sc, ch 3 and sc; sc in next 2 sts, half dc in next 2 sts, dc in next 2 sts, dec 2 dc, sc in the sc between Petals.

Repeat from * around remaining petals. Join and break off.

BUD (Make 5) . . . 1st row; With White, ch 4, in 4th ch from hook make 2 dc and 1 tr. Ch 3, turn.

2nd row: Skip first tr, dec 1 dc, ch 3, sl st in top of decreased dc, ch 3, sl st in top of starting chain. Break off.

STEM AND CALYX (Make 5) . . . With Green make a chain 1½ inches long, tr in 4th ch from hook, ch 3, sl st in tr, ch 4, sl st in same place as tr, ch 4, tr in same place as sl st, ch 3, sl st in tr, ch 4, sl st in same place as tr, sl st in each ch across. Break off. Sew Bud to Calyx.

STAMEN (Make 3) . . . With Yellow, * ch 9, ** (thread over, insert hook in 3rd ch from hook) 3 times; thread over and draw through all loops on hook (dc cluster made), ch 4. Repeat from ** once more, ending with ch 6, sl st in first ch of ch-9. Repeat from * 3 more times. Break off.

Sew Flowers, Buds and Stems to garter.

The following nut cups make wonderful décor for your wedding table, as well as a wonderful gift for the bride's new home.

Water Lily Nut Cup



MATERIALS: DAISY Mercerized Crochet Cotton size 20. 1-skein each No. 26 Lt. Blue and No. 10 Yellow. Steel crochet hook No. 12.

BASE—With Blue, ch 8, join with sl st to form ring. **ROW 1**—Ch 3, 17 dc in ring, join to top of ch-3.

ROW 2--Ch 3, dc in same st, 2 dc in each dc around, join.

ROW 3—Ch 3, dc in same st, (dc in next dc, 2 dc in next dc) repeat around, join.

ROW 4—(Sc in 5 sts, 2 sc in next st) 10 times (63 sc). Join. Fasten off.

LARGE PETAL—With Blue, ch 26, sc in 2d st from hook, hdc in next ch, dc in next 2 ch, tr in next 15 ch, dc in next 3 ch, hdc in next 2 ch, 3 sc in end ch.

Working on other side of ch, make hdc in next 2 ch, dc in next 3 ch, tr in next 15 ch, dc in next 2 ch, hdc in next ch, sc in next ch, join with sl st in 1st sc.

ROW 2--Ch 3, (dc in next 4 sts, 2 dc in next st) 3 times, dc in next 5 sts, hdc in next 3 sts, sc in next st, (sc, ch 4, sc) in next st, sc in next st, hdc in next 3 sts, (dc in next 4 sts, 2 dc in next st) 3 times, dc in next 6 sts. Fasten off.

Make 16. Sew 9 around edge of Base. Sew remaining 7 to Base just inside 1st row.

SMALL PETAL—With Blue ch 21, sc in 2d ch from hook, hdc in next 2 ch, dc in next 12 ch, hdc in next 3 ch, sc in next ch, 3 sc in end ch. Working on other side of ch, make sc in next ch, hdc in next 3 ch, dc in next 12 ch, hdc in next 2 ch, sc in next ch, join with sl st in 1st sc.

ROW 2--Ch 1, (hdc in next 4 sts, 2 hdc in next st) twice, hdc in next 6 sts, sc in next 3 sts, (sc, ch 4, sc) in next st, sc in next 3 sts, (hdc in next 4 sts, 2 hdc in next st) twice, hdc in next 7 sts. Fasten off.

Make 9. Sew to Base just inside 2d row of petals.

CUP—With Yellow, repeat Base thru Row 3.

ROW 4— Ch 3, dc in same st, (dc in next 8 dc, 2 dc in next dc) repeated around (60 dc).

ROW 5--Ch 3, dc in each dc around, join. Repeat Row 5 four times (thru Row 9). Fasten off.

Edge—Join Blue to 1 dc, (ch 5, sl st in next dc, ch 1, sl st in next dc) repeated around. Join and fasten off.

Sew bottom of Cup to center of Base. Dip Nut Cup in medium thick, hot starch. Wipe off excess. As starch dries, arrange petals and cup in even shape. Beginning with inner row of Small Petals, and working out to outside row, bottom of petals can be tacked to bottom of cup to help hold them in position.

Nut Cups



MATERIALS--Lily Soft Spun Yarn:--1 ball each Pink, Blue, Green and Yellow (sufficient for 12 Cups), with crochet hook size 3; Lily Sil-Tone Mercerized Crochet Cotton:--1 ball each Med. Green, Beauty Rose, Blue, Orange and Lavender, with crochet hook size 10.

SAUCER--In Green Soft Spun. ch 2, 9 sc in starting st. * In back lps only, make 2 sc in each sc around. Mark end of rows.

ROW 3--(Sc in next sc, 2 sc in next) repeated around.

ROW 4--(Sc in 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc) repeated around. * Continue for 3 more rows, 1 more sc between widenings in each row. Put each widening in the 2d sc of each widening in previous row.

ROW 8--Sc in each sc around with one widening to make 64 sc.

ROW 9--Sc in each sc around.

EDGE--Sc in 3 sc, sl st in next 2 sc, (ch 1, dc in next sc, ch 1, sl st in next sc) repeated around. Fasten off.

CUP--Ch 2, 8 sc in starting st. Repeat Saucer from * to *.

ROWS 5 thru 12-(Make next row even, without widenings. Make next row with only one widening) 4 times.

ROW 13--Work even.

ROW 14--Repeat Edge.

HANDLE--Ch 2, 5 sc in starting st. In back lps, sc in each sc around and around for 2 1/4". Sl st in next 2 sc. Fasten off. Sew on cup for a handle. Tack Cup on Saucer.

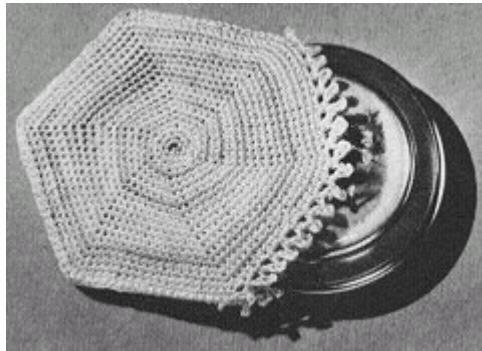
LEAF SPRAY--In Green Sil-Tone, ** ch 11, * sk last st, (sl st, sc, 2 hdc and sl st) on ch, * (ch 6 and repeat from * to *) twice. Sk 3 leaves, sl st in ch-5 stem. Repeat from **. Fasten off. Make 5.

FLOWER In Beauty Rose Sil-Tone, (ch 4, dc in 4th ch from hook, ch 3, sl st in same st) 5 times, sl st at base of 1st petal. Fasten off. Make 5. Sew a flower on center of stem between leaves. Tack one on each side of Cup and 3 on Saucer.

Make 2d Cup and Saucer of Blue with Orange flowers, a 3d Set of Yellow Soft Spun with Lavender flowers, and a Pink Set with Blue flowers.

Rub the handle, inside of Cup and bottom of Saucer with a pad of cloth dipped in hot, thick starch. As starch sets, arrange Cups and Saucers in true shape.

Round Compact Cover



Materials: dark's O.N.T. "Brilliant", 1 ball of any self-shading or solid color. Milward's steel crochet hook No. 8.

Starting at center, ch 2.

1st rnd: 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook.

2nd rnd: 2 sc in each s c around.

3rd rnd: * Sc in next s c. 2 sc in next s c. Repeat from * around.

Continue to make s c in each s c) increasing 6 sc at equal distances apart on each rnd, having increases fall directly over those of previous rnd. until piece covers one side of compact. Work 1 rnd without increasing. Do not break off, but make picot edge as follows: * Ch 4, sl st in 3rd st from hook, ch 1, skip 1 s c, sl st in next s c. Repeat from * across 2 sides of hexagon. Fasten and break off.

Make another piece same as this, but do not break off. Place the 2 pieces together, having picot edges match, and sl st through both thicknesses around the other 4 sides of hexagon. Fasten and break off.

Shell Napkin Ring



1st row—ch. 12. sc. back or ch. to end.

2nd Row—14 ch. 1 t.

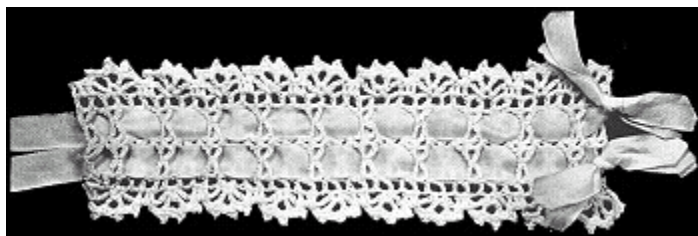
3rd Row—4 ch. 1 sc. 4 ch. 1 sc. 4 ch. 1 sc. 4 ch. 1 sc.

4th Row—Same as 3rd row.

5th Row—Same as 3rd row with 3 p.

6th Row—14 ch. sc. back on 12 repeat until lace is desired length, finish each edge with half rings of 6 ch. 3 ch. catch back on sc. sc. back on 3 ch. 4 sc. (1 ch. 1 t. for 6 t.) catch at end where thread is fastened, tu. 1 sc. 1 t. 1 sc. and each s. back. Begin next half ring.

Club Napkin Ring

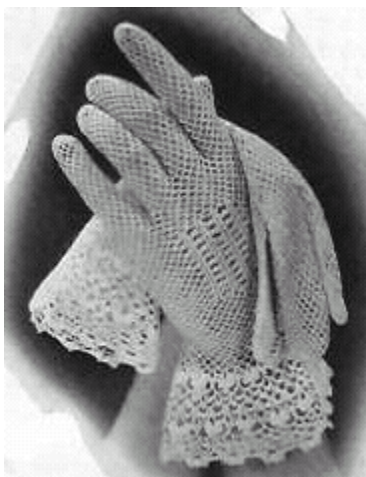


1st Row—24 ch. go back to 2 ch. ch. 4. catch in 16 ch. ch. 4. 1 t. 1 ch. 1 t. ch. 4. catch in 8 ch. ch. 4. 1 t. in fourth ch. 2 ch. catch at beginning.

2nd Row—4 ch. 1 t. 6 ch. 1 t. 1 ch. 1 t. 6 ch. 1 t. 2 ch. 1 t. tu.

3rd Row—4 ch. 1 t. 4 ch. sc. catch in middle of previous 6th ch. 4 ch. 1 t. 1 ch. 1 t. 4 ch. catch in 6 ch. 4 ch. 1 t. 2 ch. 1 t. tu. Repeat until lace is desired length, finish with half rings. Fasten thread. 6 ch. catch in 3rd s. from end, 3 ch. catch in same s. 4 ch. 1 t. in 5 t. from end tu. 2 ch. 1 t. 2 ch. 1 t. 2 ch. catch where thread is fastened, tu.

Crochet Gloves with Irish Cuffs



Materials: Clark's ONT or J & P Coats Mercerized Crochet 2 balls, White, size 70. Steel crochet hook No. 10.

LEFT HAND: Beginning at wrist, ch 162, and sl st in 1st ch to form ring.

1st rnd: * Ch 5, skip 5 ch, 1 s c in next ch, and repeat from * around.

2nd rnd: * Ch 5, 1 s c in next loop, and repeat from * around.

3rd rnd: Same as 2nd rnd but making ch-4 loops.

4th to 8th rnds incl: Same as 2nd rnd making ch-3 loops.

9th and 10th rnds: Make ch-4 loops.

11th to 17th rnds incl: Make ch-5 loops.

18th rnd: Ch 5, 1 s c in same loop as last s c. * Ch 5, 1 s c in next loop, and repeat from * 14 more times. ** Ch 3, 1 s c in same loop as last s c, ch 3, 1 s c in next loop, ** and repeat from ** to ** twice more. Then ch 3, 1 s c in next loop and repeat from ** to ** 3 more times. Then continue around with ch-5 loops.

19th rnd: Work 16 ch-5 loops, then ch 4, 1 s c in. 1st ch-3 loop, * ch 3, 1 s c in same loop, ch 5, skip 3 ch-3 loops of previous rnd, 1 s c in next loop, and repeat from * twice more. Ch 3, 1 s c in same loop as last s c, ch 4, 1 s c in next loop and work around with ch-5 loops.

20th rnd: Make an extra loop (an increase) in the 2nd loop of previous row to form a dart on the inside of the thumb begun in the 18th rnd. Repeat this extra loop every other rnd, making it 1 loop to the left of the last increase, until 7 extra loops (14 rnds) have been made. On the back of the hand, work around to the last ch-5 loop on the 20th rnd, skip ch-4 loop, ch 5, * 1 s c in ch-3 loop, ch 3, 1 s c in same loop, ch 3, 1 s c in middle ch of ch-5, ch 3, * 1 s c in same place as last s c, ch 3, and repeat from * to * twice more. Then 1 s c in same place as last s c, ch 3, 1 s c in next ch-3 loop, ch 3, 1 s c in same loop, ch 4, 1 s c in next loop. Then work around with ch-5 loops.

21st to 37th rnds: Repeat the design on the back of hand as in the 19th and 20th rnds alternately, 8 more times (19 rnds of design in all). Make the thumb opening on the 33rd rnd.

33rd rnd: Work to the extra loop in the last row, ch 30 (for thumb opening) skip 11 loops, then work on around as before.

34th rnd: Work to the last loop just before ch-30, ch 5, 1 s c in 3rd ch, * ch 5, skip ch-5, 1 s c in next ch and repeat from * for length of the extra ch.

38th to 46th rnd incl: Continue on around in ch-5 loops.

FINGERS. Put glove on so that the design will come in center of back of band and thumb opening in right position, and mark fingers by putting a safety pin on palm and back of hand between each finger.

FOREFINGER. Work ch-5 loops around making ch 6 to join the loops together that have been held together by a pin between forefinger and middle finger. Do not remove pin. Work in spiral for about 23 rnds, or until 1½" less than desired length. It is better not to have fingers too long. * Then make 1 rnd of ch-4 loops, 2 rnds of ch-3 loops, 1 rnd of ch-2 loops, 1 rnd of ch-1 loops, then skip every other loop until edges are brought together. Break off *.

MIDDLE FINGER. Attach thread to loop at pin on palm side between ring finger and middle finger. Work loops across, making s c in loop where previous pin is, 2 loops over ch 6 between fingers, ch 5, s c in loop where same pin is on back of hand, work loops across, making ch 6 to join the loops together that have been held together by the pin between middle finger and ring finger. Work in spiral making loops until 1½" less than desired length. Then repeat from * to * of forefinger.

RING and LITTLE FINGER. Same as forefinger and middle finger.

THUMB. Attach thread to a loop on palm side of hand and work as for fingers.

CUFF. 1st and 2nd rnds: Attach thread at wrist and work ch-6 loops for 2 rnds.

3rd rnd: Ch 3, 1 d c in same loop, ch 3, * 1 d c in next loop, ch 5, 1 d c in same loop, ch 3, and repeat from * around, ending with s c in ch-3 first made.

4th rnd: Ch 4, * skip ch-2, 3 d c over ch-5, ch 3, 6 d c in same loop, ch 3, and 3 more d c in same loop (12 d c in all), ch 2, 1 s c in next ch-5 loop, ch 3, 1 s c in same loop, ch 2, and repeat from * around, ending with 1 s c in ch-4 first made.

5th rnd: Ch 9, * 1 s c between 6th and 7th d c of 12-d c group, ch 3, 1 s c in same place, ch 7, 1 s c in ch-3 loop (between 2 s c), ch 7, and repeat from * around, ending rnd with s c in s c just before ch-9.

6th rnd: Ch 5, d c in ch-9 loop, ch 5, d c in same loop, ch 1, * a ch-5 p, ch 1, 1 d c in next ch-7 loop, ch 5, 1 d c in same loop, ch 1, and repeat from * around, ending with 1 s c in ch-5 loop first made.

7th rnd: Ch 3, 1 s c under ch-5, * ch 3, 1 s c in same loop, ch 6, 1 s c under next ch-5, and repeat from * around, ending with d c in ch-3 first made.

8th rnd: Ch 4, a ch-5 p, * 3 d c with ch-1 between d c's in next ch-6 loop, ch 1, 1 p, ch 1, and repeat from * around, ending with s c in ch-4 first made.

9th rnd: Ch 8, * 1 d c over next ch-1 (between 1st and 2nd d c), ch 5, d c over next ch-1 (between 2nd and 3rd d c's of same group), ch 3, and repeat from * around, ending with s c in ch-8 first made.

10th to 14th rnds incl: Repeat from 4th to 8th rnds incl.

15th rnd: Same as 4th rnd. Break off.

Make other glove to correspond reversing position of thumb. Starch cuffs stiffly.

Sunlight Gloves



Materials: Clark's O.N.T. (5 balls) or J. & P. Coats (3 balls) Mercerized Crochet, size 50, color 9 Yellow. Milward's steel crochet hook No. 8 or 9.

Left Hand. Beginning at wrist, ch 82 to measure 6 inches, turn.

1st row: D c in 7th ch from hook, ch 3, skip 2 ch, d c in next, ch 3, skip 2 ch, 5 d c in next, * ch 3, skip 2 ch, s c in next, ch 5, skip 2 ch, s c in next, ch 3, skip 2 ch, 5 d c in next, repeat from * until 8 groups of 5 d c are made. Ch 3, skip 2 ch, d c in next, ch 3, skip 2 ch, d c in next ch, ch 6, turn.

2nd row: Tr in next d c, ch 3, * tr in each of next 5 d c with ch-1 between trs, ch 4, s c under ch-5 loop, ch 4, repeat from * across. After the last group of 5-tr, ch 3, skip next d c, tr in next sp, ch 2, tr in last sp, ch 6, turn.

3rd row: Tr in tr, ch 2, * tr in each of next 5 tr with ch-2 between trs. Repeat from * across omitting ch-2 between groups of tr thus having the last tr of one group and the first tr of next group come together. After last group of 5-tr, ch 2, tr in next tr, ch 2, skip 2 ch, tr in next ch. Ch 5, turn.

4th row: D c in next tr, ch 2, d c in next tr, ch 3, * skip next tr, 5 d c in next tr (this is the center tr of 5-tr group), ch 3, skip next tr, s c in next sp, ch 6, skip 2 tr (which come together), s c in next sp, ch 3, repeat from * across ending to correspond with beginning of row. Ch 6, turn.

5th to 9th rows incl: Repeat 2nd, 3rd and 4th rows. Then repeat again 2nd and 3rd rows. At end of last row, join with sl st to beginning of row (thus closing up opening), hereafter work in rnds.

10th rnd: Sl st to 1st tr, ch 5, skip next sp, d c in next sp, ch 3, skip next tr, 5 d c in next tr, ch 3, skip next tr, s c in next sp, and work across as in 4th row until the last group of 5-d c is made, then ch 3, skip next tr, s c in next sp, ch 5, skip 1 sp, s c in next sp, ch 3, 5 d c at the joining point, ch 3, s c in next sp.

11th rnd: Ch 4, and work in pattern as before to 18th rnd incl. End and begin each rnd in such manner that shell patterns come directly over shell patterns as previously done.

Shaping for Thumb: Try on glove with opening at center of palm of hand. Place a safety pin on palm and back of hand separating thumb from hand (thumb to be worked on later).

19th and subsequent rnds: Attach thread in sp at pin on palm side, ch 10, s c in sp at pin at back of hand, and work in pattern around. Starting 2 5-d c shells over ch-10 (8 groups of shells in all). Work in pattern around and around the hand part of glove over 8 shells until when tried on it reaches to the base of fingers.

Fingers. Put glove on and mark fingers by putting a safety pin on palm and back of hand between each finger.

Forefinger: Attach thread to sp at pin on palm side between forefinger and middle finger. Work in pattern across to same pin on back of hand, ch 3, cross over to palm side, s c in sp at pin, and continue pattern in spiral until length desired. It is better not to have fingers too long. Draw tip together by making 2 rnds of s c. Break off. **Middle Finger:** Attach thread to sp at pin on palm side between ring finger and middle finger, work pattern across finger and around, over the 3-ch and back of hand to same pin, ch 3, cross over to palm side, work in spiral and complete as for forefinger.

Ring and Little Fingers: Same as forefinger and middle finger.

Thumb: Attach thread to sp at palm side of hand and work as for forefinger.

Gauntlet. 1st rnd: Attach thread at opening point on foundation ch at wrist. Ch 3, skip 1 sp and d c, * 5 d c in next ch st, ch 3, skip next 5-d c shell, s c in next loop. Ch 5, skip s c, s c in next loop. Ch 3, skip next s c, repeat from * spacing work so that 11 5-d c groups are made, then ch 3, s c in 1st st of ch-3 first made.

2nd rnd: Ch 5, * tr in each of next 5-d c with ch-1 between each tr, ch 4, s c in ch-5 loop, ch 4, repeat from * around. After the last tr, ch 4, s c under ch-5 loop.

3rd rnd: Ch 5, * tr in each of next 5-tr with ch-2 between trs, repeat from * around omitting ch-2 between group, of trs (thus having the last tr of one group and first tr of next group come together). After last tr, ch 2, skip next loop, d c in next loop.

4th rnd: Ch 5, s c in next sp, ch 4, skip next tr, 5 d c in next tr, * ch 4, s c in next tr, ch 5, s c in next tr (hereafter the 2 trs coming together are counted as 1 tr). Ch 4, 3 d c in next tr, repeat from * around ending with s c under ch-5 loop, ch 5, s c under next loop.

5th to 17th rnds incl: Repeat 2nd, 3rd and 4th rnds. Finish opening with 1 row of s c with 2 ch-loops on one side of opening for buttons. Sew buttons on opposite side to correspond.

Right Hand. Make the same as for left hand, only being careful that the fingers are made to correspond with the right hand.

Sunlight Hat



Materials: Clark's O.N.T. (5 balls) or J. & P. Coats (3 balls) Mercerized Crochet, size 30, color 9 Yellow. Milward's steel crochet hook No. 7. 2 yds. millinery wire and 2 yds. of ribbon.

Crown. Beginning at tip, ch 10, join with sl st to form ring.

1st rnd: * Ch 10, s c in ring, repeat from * until 24 loops are made, then ch 6.

2nd rnd: S c in 1st loop, * ch 5, s c in next loop, repeat from * around, ending, with s c under ch-6 of previous rnd.

3rd rnd: Ch 5, s c in each loop with ch-5 between s cs.

4th rnd: * Ch 3, 5 d c under next loop, ch 3, s c in next loop, ch 4, s c in same loop, repeat from * until 12 5-d c groups are made, then ch 3, s c in next loop, ch 5, s c in next loop, ch 2, s c in first d c of 5-d c group.

5th rnd: Ch 5 (to count as tr and ch-1), tr in each of next 4 d c with ch-1 between each tr, * ch 4, s c in next ch-4 loop, ch 4, tr in each d c of group with ch-1 between each tr, repeat froal around. After last group of trs is made, ch 4, s c in next ch-4 loop, ch 4, sl st in 4th ch of ch-5 first made.

6th rnd: Ch 6 (to count as tr and ch-2), tr in each tr with ch-2 between trs, but omitting ch-2 between groups (that is between last tr

of one group and 1st tr of next group). After last tr, join with sl st in 4th ch of ch-6 first made and sl st to 1st tr.

7th rnd: * Ch 5, s c under next ch-2 sp, repeat from * around (do not make s cs between 2 trs that come together without ch-2 between), ending with ch 5, s c in 1st loop.

8th rnd: * Ch 3, 5 d c under next loop, ch 3, s c in next loop, ch 5, s c in next loop, repeat from * ending with last s c in ch-3 first made.

9th rnd: * Ch 4, tr in each of next 5 d c with ch l between trs, ch 4, s c in ch-5 loop, repeat from * ending with sl st in 4th st of ch-4 first made.

10th rnd: Same as 6th rnd, ending with sl st in 4th st of ch-6 first made.

11th rnd: Same as 7th rnd, ending with ch 5, sl st in 1st loop.

12th rnd: Same as 8th rnd.

13th rnd: Same as 9th rnd. After last group of trs is made, ch 4, sl st in 4th st of ch-4 first made.

14th rnd: Same as 6th rnd.

15th rnd: Ch 5, s c under next ch-2 sp, ch 5, skip next 2 tr, s c under next ch-2 sp, ch 5, s c under next ch-2 sp, * ch 5, skip next 2-tr (that are together), s c under next ch-2 sp, ch 5, skip next 2 tr, s c under next ch-2 sp, ch 5, s c under next ch-2 sp, repeat from * ending with ch 5, s c in sl st.

16th rnd: Ch 5, s c under next ch-5 loop, then repeat from * of 8th rnd. After last group of d cs are made, ch 3, s c under next ch-5 loop, ch 6, skip next loop, s c under next loop.

17th rnd: Same as 9th rnd. After last group of trs is made, ch 4, s c under ch-6 loop.

18th rnd: Ch 4, tr in each tr with ch-2 between trs, but omitting ch-2 between groups (as in 6th rnd). After last tr, join with sl st in 4th st of ch-4 first made.

19th rnd: Same as 15th rnd, ending with ch-5, s c under 1st ch-5 loop.

20th rnd: Same as 8th rnd. After last group of d c is made, ch 3, s c under next loop, ch 5, s c under next loop.

21st rnd: Ch 4, tr in each of next 5 d c with ch-1 between trs, then repeat from * of 5th rnd. After last group of tr is made, ch 4, s c under next loop.

22nd rnd: Same as 6th rnd, but end with s c in 6th st of ch-6.

23rd rnd: Ch 4, and make 2 tr under each ch-2 sp and 1 tr in each tr. Join with sl st. Do not break off.

Brim. 1st rnd: * Ch 6, skip 2 tr, s c in next tr, repeat from * around.

2nd rnd: Ch 5, s c under next loop, then repeat from * of 8th rnd of crown, around.

3rd rnd: Same as 9th rnd of crown.

4th rnd: Same as 6th rnd of crown. After last tr, join with sl st in 6th st of ch-6 first made.

5th rnd: Same as 7th rnd of crown.

6th to 12th rnds incl: Repeat from 8th to 14th rnds of crown incl.

13th rnd: S c in each tr and 2 s c (and sometimes 3 s c to keep work flat) in each sp.

14th and 15th rnds: S c in each s c. With thread double work a rnd of s c holding along wire and working over it so that it is completely covered. Fasten wire neatly. Break off. Sew ribbon band inside of crown adjusting headsize. Starch hat or use white shellac and block. Trim hat as in illustration.

Gloves and Bag



MATERIALS: 3 tubes Tower Brand Plyon for bag and gloves. Steel crochet hook No. 10. 1 pair Tower Brand Plastic "Bagbones". 8 inch slide fastener. Same instructions for right and left gloves.

GLOVES: To Start: Ch 90 and join.

1ST RND: Ch 2, * 1 dc, skip 2, ch 2, repeat between *'s.

Make 4 more rounds like 1st round (30 loops around).

6TH RND: Like 1st round, but increase 1 loop in the 3rd and 6th loops. Then make 9 more rounds like 6th round, increasing 1 loop in each increased loop of previous round.

16TH to 19TH RNDs: Like 1st round.

20TH RND: Work up to the 1st increase, ch 10, skip 10 loops, for thumb, dc in next loop, work around like 1st round and make 4 loops over the ch 10 (44 loops).

21ST to 28TH RNDs: Like 1st round.

LITTLE FINGER: Count 13 loops from the last increase of the thumb, ch 9, skip 10 loops, 1 sc in the next loop, sl st back of the ch sts, make loops in the 10 loops and 3 loops on the sl st (13 loops). Work 7 rounds no increase, next round decrease 1 loop between fingers (all decreases should be on the side between the fingers). Then make 1 round with loops of 1 ch instead of 2. Next round dc only. Finish finger with 2 sc. Break off.

NEXT FINGER: Begin finger on inside the glove. Make sl st on sc of ch st. Work loops around the glove until you come to 5 loops before the little finger. Ch 7, sc on other side (outside) of glove 5 loops from little finger, make loops around, (15 loops). Work 2 rounds even.

Next round decrease 1 loop. Make 2 rounds even, 1 round decrease, 2 rounds even, 1 round decrease, 2 rounds even, next round with ch 2 loops, next round with ch 1 loops, next round dc only. Finish off same as little finger.

MIDDLE FINGER: Work same as other finger. Make 16 loops. Decrease in 4th, 6th and 10th rounds. Work 14th round with ch 1 loops.

Next round with dc. Finish off. 4th finger same as other finger. 16 loops.

Decrease in 4th, 6th and 9th rounds. 13th round with ch 1 loops.

THUMB: Work 2 rounds even. Decrease 1 loop every other round, 4 times.

Next 2 rounds decrease ea round.

Next round even.

Next round with ch 1 loops.

Next round with dc. Finish off.

BORDER: At beginning of glove, make 2 sc in ea loop, 1 sc in the dc.

MOTIF FOR CUFFS & BAG Ch 7 and join to form ring.

1ST RND: Ch 3, 23 dc in ring, join with sl st to 3rd st of ch 3 first made.

2ND RND: Ch 5, skip 1, 1 sc (making loop). Make 11 loops same as the 1st, on the 12th loop make 2 ch and 1 dc in the sc of the 1st loop.

3RD RND: * Ch 7 and sc into the loop * repeat between *'s around, then close the row with ch 3 and 1 dc in the dc of the 1st loop.

4TH RND: * 12 dc in loop, sc in next loop, ch 8 and sc in next loop * repeat between *'s around, closing with ch 4 and triple crochet in the 1st dc.

5TH RND: ** Ch 5, dc in the 2nd dc, * ch 1, dc in next dc * repeat between *'s 9 times more, ch 2, dc in middle of loop, then repeat from ** around.

6TH RND: Ch 5, sc in loop, ch 5, sc between the 2nd and 3rd dc of previous round, ch 5, sc after the 4th dc of previous round, ch 5, sc in next ch 1 space, ch 7, sc in same space, ch 5, sc in next space, ch 5, skip 1 dc, sc in next dc (This makes the corner). Work around the same way for the other sides.

TO JOIN MOTIFS: Place motifs together and with ch 3, sc one ch 7 to the ch 7 of adjoining motif, then join the ch 5 loops across round with ch 2 and sc to ch 5 loops of adjoining motif. Join 4 motifs and attach to glove. On edge of glove make 5 sc in ea loop.

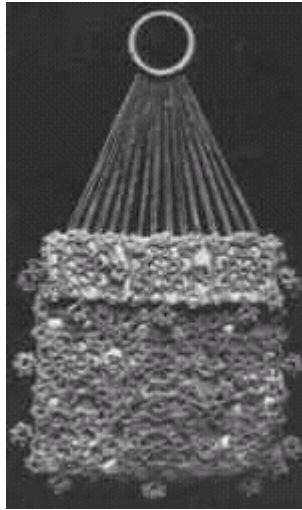
BAG: To start: Ch 60, dc in 4th ch from hook.

Make 21 rows of dc. Make 12 motifs and join as illustrated.

Then attach to center piece. Make other side of bag the same way. Join both sides of bag. Sew "bagbones" inside bag $3\frac{1}{4}$ inch from top. Sew in lining and slide fastener.

HANDLES: Using yarn double, make a ch 25 inches long. Make 8 chains and braid 4 each for 2 handles. Attach to bag.

Vintage Purse



Art. 131, N. E. T. (Crochet Twist), White or Ecu

Begin with 6 chain, join into ring by slip stitch.

1st round. 4 ch, for long treble (lt: thread over needle twice). 3 ch, making 7 in all, 1 1t into the ring, 3 ch, 1 1t into the ring, * 3 ch, 1 1t into the ring, repeat from * until there are 8, 1 lt into the ring, after the last lt work 3 ch, sl st into the top of the 4 ch worked from the 1st 1t.

2d round. 3 d, 5 ch, 3 d into the 1st sp of 3 ch of previous round, * 3 d, 5 ch, 3 d into the next sp, repeat from * into each of the 8 sp; there will be 6 d between each p of 5 ch.

3d round. * 9 ch, 1 lt into the d over the 1st lt between 2 p of the previous round, 9 ch, 1 d into the d over the next lt between 2 p, repeat from * into each of the lt, ,after the last 9 ch, sl st into the 1st 9 ch instead of the the d.

4th round. After the last sl st of the previous round work 12 ch from the medallion, sl st into the 10th loop from the needle, into this ring work 2 d, 5 ch, 2 d, 5 ch, 2 d, 5 ch, 2 d, 5 ch, 2 d, 5 ch, 2 d, 2 ch, 1 d into the same d in the circle as the 12 ch was begun from, and into the 1st sp of 9 ch work 4 d, draw the thread through the 1st p on the side of the ring just worked, 6 d into the same sp of 9 ch 1 d into the t of the previous round, * 12 ch, sl st into the 10th loop from the needle,

into this ring work 2 d, 5 ch, 2 ch, 5 ch, 2 d, 5 ch, 2 d, 5 ch, 2 d, 5 ch, 2 d, 2 ch, 1 d into the t of the previous round, into the next sp of 9 ch work 10 d, 1 d into the d of the previous round, 12 ch, sl st into the 10th loop from the needle, into this ring work 2 d, 3 ch, draw the thread through the 4th d from the needle of the 10 d of the previous sp, 2 ch, 2 d, 5 ch, 2 d, 5 ch, 2 d, 5 ch, 2 d, 5 ch, 2 d, 2 ch, 1 d into the same d as the 12 ch was begun from, 4 d into the next sp of 9 ch, draw the thread through the 1st p on the ring just worked, 6 d into the same sp, 1 d into the next t of the previous round, repeat from * around circle. When making the last 10 d on the last sp of 9 ch work first 6 d, then draw thread through the 1st p on the ring just worked, and then work 4 d into same sp, finish off firmly with a needle. Join one medallion to another by the last round on the pattern the following way: ** Begin with the small ring on the corner of the medallion and work 12 ch, sl st into the 10th loop from the needle, into this ring work 2 d, 3 ch, draw the thread through the 4th d from the needle of the 10 d of the previous sp, 3 ch, 2 d into the ring, 5 ch, 2 d, 3 ch, draw the thread through the 3d p on the corner ring of the previous pattern, 3 ch, 2 d into the ring, 5 ch, 2 d, 5 ch, 2 d, 2 ch, 1 d into the same d as the 12 ch was begun from, 4 d into the next sp of 9 ch, draw the thread through the 1st p on the side of ring just worked, 6 ch, 1 d into the t of previous round, draw the thread through the 3d p on the next ring on the side of previous pattern, 10 d into the next sp of 9 ch, 1 d into the d of the previous round, 12 ch, sl st into the 10th loop from the needle, into this ring work 2 d, 3 ch, draw the thread through the 4th d from the needle of the 10 d of the previous sp, 2 ch, 2 d into the ring, 5 ch, 2 d, 3 ch, draw the thread through the 3d p on the next corner ring of the previous pattern, 3 ch, 2 d into the ring, 5 ch, 2 d, 5 ch, 2 d, 2 ch, 1 d into the d on which the 12 ch was begun from, repeat from ** for all the joinings. After 2 rows are joined together there should be 4 p of 5 ch joined to each other at the corners of each pattern. When joining down the sides and across the bottom there should be a pattern or small flower on each side joined by the p at the top. There are 18 medallions which form the bag. Around the top of the bag make 1 row of t (thread over needle twice), except when there is a p, when you make a single crochet. There are 3 medallions which make the flap. Join them together, following the directions for joining medallions of bag; when joining to the row of mesh around the top of bag make the connection directly over the medallion on bag, Fasten featherbone across back in hem of lining.

For the Strings

Join the thread to the corner of bag, ch 65, draw the ch through 1st mesh between flap and bag and join with d to a large bone ring, ch 65 and draw thread through same mesh, join with d to the same place where 1st ch of 65 started, 3 d into next sp, 1 d into next sp, ch 64, skip one mesh and pass the chain through the next, 1 d to ring, ch 64, pass the ch through the same mesh and continue across bag, making each ch about 1 less as you go towards the center of bag and increase 1 st as you go towards the other end, being careful to have the chains the correct length, and finish with 65 ch.

Wheel Bag



Materials: Clarks O.N.T. Mercerized Crochet, Ecru, size 50, lined with rose colored silk. Hook No. 11. It is both dainty and durable.

Ch 10, join, in ring work 16 tr, 1 ch after each. Join. Make sc in each sp, 3 ch between. Join and fasten off.

Wheel measures 5 $\frac{1}{8}$ inch across.

Repeat for 2nd wheel, until 6 loops have been made in last round. Ch 1, sc in loop of 1st wheel, ch 1, sc in next sp of 2nd wheel, ch 1, sc in next loop of 1st wheel, ch 1, sc in next sp of 2nd wheel.

Finish 2nd wheel. Have 6 loops at each side each wheel when joined.

Make 2 strips each of 21, 22 and 23 wheels. Join 2 longest strips first. Lay them side by side.

Make 1 tr tr in 3rd, then in 2nd loop after joining, in 2nd wheel of left hand strip, holding last loops back of needle. Make 1 tr tr each in 2nd and 3rd loops before joining of 1st wheel of same strip, holding last loops back. Make tr tr in 2nd and 3rd loops before joining in 1st wheel of other strip, then in 2nd and 3rd loops of 2nd wheel. Draw through all loops and fasten. Join all wheels in all strips in this way. Have all strips even at one end, at other end have longest strips at center, shortest at sides. Shaped end is flap. Work half spiders at ends to make even.

Fold bag to shape, front 9 wheels deep. Join sides with spiders. Make tassel with crocheted top at bottom of each strip. Make twisted cord handle, draw through top spider each side. Finish end with crocheted ball and 2 tassels. Close with button and tasseled buttonloop.

Irish Lace Bag



Irish Lace Bag: Ch 7, join, in ring work 10 s c. Join after each round of work.

2nd round-Ch 5 (to count as 1 tr and 2 ch) tr in 2nd s c, * ch 2, tr in next s c, and repeat from * around. 10 sps in round.

3rd round-Ch 7, skip 1 tr, s c in next, and repeat from beginning around. 5 loops in round.

4th round-In each loop make 1 s c, 8 tr, 1 s c.

5th round-Slip st down to back of s c of 3rd round. * Ch 8, s c in next s c of 3rd round and repeat around.

6th round-In each ch loop make 1 s c, 9 tr, 1 s c.

7th round-Slip st down back to s c of 5th round -- * Ch 9, s c in next s c, and repeat from * around.

8th round-In each ch loop make 1 s c, 1 tr, 9 d tr, 1 tr, 1 s c. This completes center rose.

9th Round-Ch 25 (1st 3 ch count as 1 tr), slip st in 22nd ch from needle, * ch 9, slip st in 5th d tr of rose petal, ch 21, slip st in same d tr. Ch 9, 1 tr between petals, ch 21, slip st in tr last worked. Repeat from * around.

10th round-Slip st along 1st 5 sts of 21 ch. d 5 (to count as 1 tr tr), * 1 tr tr each in next 2 ch, 1 long tr (wind 4 times) each in next 3 ch, in next ch make 1 long tr, 1 ch, 1 long tr, 1 ch, 1 long tr. In each of next 3 ch make 1 long tr, 1 tr tr each in next 3 ch, 1 long tr in center st of 9 ch, 1 tr tr in 5th st of 21 ch. Repeat from * around. This completes leaves.

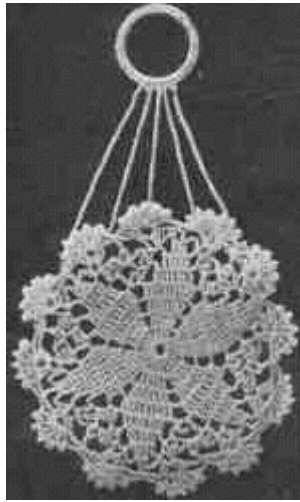
11th Round-Ch 12 (to count as 1 tr tr and 7 ch), s c in 5th ch from needle, * ch 7, s c in 5th ch from needle, ch 2, s c in long tr at top of leaf, ch 7, s c in 5th ch from needle, ch 7, s c in 5th ch, ch 2, tr tr in long tr between leaves. Ch 7, s c in 5th ch, and repeat from * around.

12th round-Slip st to center between 2 picots, *ch 7 and picot, ch 7 and picot, ch 2, s c between 2 picots of next loop and repeat from * twice around.

14th round-Slip st to center of 1st loop, midway between picots. Ch 14 (to count as 1 tr and 11 ch), * tr in center of next loop. Ch 11, repeat from * around.

15th round-1 tr in every 2nd st, 1 ch between. Make 1 round of 1 s c in each st, then 1 round of 1 slip st in each st.

Dainty Coin Purse



No dimensions are given or material used.

Rd 1. Chain 3, 2 trebles in ring, (chain 2, 3 trebles in ring) 5 times, chain 2, join to top of 3 chain.

Rd 2. Chain 3, a treble in same place, treble in next treble and 2 in 3d, making 5 in all, (chain 2, 5 trebles over 3 trebles)) 5 times, chain 2, join.

Rd 3. (Make 7 trebles over 5 trebles, chain 2) 6 times, join.

Rd 4. (Make 9 trebles over 7 trebles, chain 3) 6 times, join.

Rd 5. Slip to 2d treble, chain 3, 6 trebles in 6 trebles, * chain 6, fasten under 3 chain, chain 6, fasten under same chain, chain 6, 7 trebles over 9 trebles, missing 1st and last; repeat around, joining last 6 chain to top of 3 chain.

Rd 6. Make 5 trebles over 7 trebles, missing 1st and last, chain 6, fasten under 6 chain, chain 6, fasten in same loop, chain 6, miss 1 loop, fasten in next, chain 6, fasten in same, chain 6; repeat around, join.

Rd 7. Make 3 trebles over 5 trebles, (chain 6, fasten in next loop, chain 6, fasten in same, miss 1 loop) twice, chain 6, fasten in next, chain 6, fasten in same, chain 6; repeat around, join.

Rd 8. A treble in center of 3 trebles (chain 3 for 1st), chain 3, 2 trebles, 3 chain and 2 trebles in 2d loop, chain 3, shell of 2 trebles, 3 chain and 2 trebles in next 2d loop, chain 3; repeat around, join.

Rd 9. Chain 2, * a treble in shell, chain 3, fasten back in top of treble for a picot; repeat until you have made 5 picots, a treble in same shell, chain 2, fasten in top of single treble; repeat until you have made 5 scallops for the top of purse, and fasten off. By continuing the scallops entirely around, you have a very pretty little doily.

Make the other side in the same way, and after having made the 5 scallops place the two sides together and work the remaining 7 scallops in both, that is, in a shell of each, thus joining them.

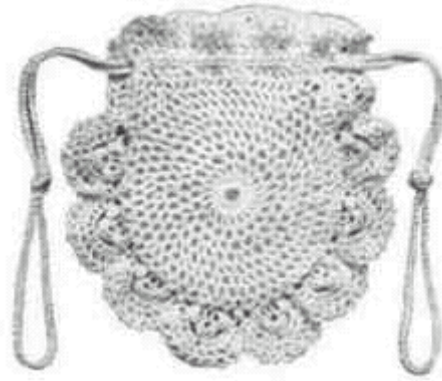
For the chains, start from center of 1st scallop at side of opening, chain 45, pass through corresponding space on opposite side, join to a brass ring, one inch in diameter, which has been closely filled with double crochet, a double in next double of the ring, chain 40, pass back through 2d scallop, and fasten to scallop next that from which you started; slip to next scallop on same side, chain 35, pass through 3d scallop on opposite side, join to ring, as before, chain 40, pass through 4th scallop and fasten to corresponding scallop opposite, skip to next scallop on same side, chain 45, pass through 5th scallop and join to ring. If preferred, the ring may not be filled until the chains are joined; then work around, join and fasten off, leaving a length of thread which may be put into a needle and run partially around the ring.

The purse may be lined or not, as preferred, as the work is close enough to prevent coins slipping through. A little pocket of chamois may be slipped in, if desired. The purse is especially pretty if made of black, gray, cardinal or other color of purse-silk.

Treble Crochet : Put thread over needle as if to make a chain stitch, insert hook in work and draw thread through, making 3 stitches on needle; (take up thread and draw through 2) twice. Many prefer to

make what is called a "long treble", drawing first through 1 stitch, then through 2 stitches twice, as directed.

Handy Boudoir Bag



Handy Boudoir Bag is made of Clark's O.N.T. Pearl Cotton, Size 3, and Clark's O.N.T. Hook No. 7.

Ch 8, join, ch 3, 20 tr in ring. Join at end each round.

2nd round - Ch 4, to in each tr, 1 ch after each, 21 sps in round.

3rd round - Tr in each sp, 2 ch after each.

4th round - Same as 3rd round, but increase by making 2 tr with 2 ch between in every 3rd sp. Make 4 rounds more, increasing over increasings.

Trefoils - Make 22 sps, without increasing. * Ch 5, s c in next sp, ch 5, s c in next; ch 10, s c in 7th ch from hook, ch 5, s c in ring, ch 5, s c in ring, ch 5, s c in catching st of ring. Turn, over each 5 ch make 1 s c, 6 tr, 1 s c. Ch 3, s c in next sp of round, ch 5, s c in next sp. Repeat from * to beginning of round, 8 trefoils. Slip st along 2 sps. Make 18 sps, slip st along next 2 sps to 1st loop. * Ch 2, s c in center of 1st petal, ch 8, s c in center of 2nd petal, ch 8, s c in 3rd petal. Ch 2, s c in next loop, repeat from * around.

Work 3 rows sps across sps of top, narrowing 1 sp each end each row. At end of last row make 1 tr and 2 ch alternately to 1st trefoil.

Continue around trefoils, skipping 5 sts between them, and 1 st each time around top. Make another round sps, then final round loops.

Make back same as front, omitting trefoils. Make sps across top to correspond with front, finish edge with loops, sew against front on loop round with which trefoils started. Make ch st cord, using double thread.

Orchid



Materials Required: AMERICAN THREAD COMPANY "STAR" RAYON CROCHET, Article 700 1 ball White. 25 inches White covered spool wire. 8 inches medium wire. Yellow and Purple pastel crayons. Steel crochet hook No. 7.

LARGE PETAL: Ch 4, 4 dc in 4th st from hook, ch 3, turn.

2nd Row. S c in next d c, * ch 2, sc in next d c, repeat from * once, ch 2, sc in 3rd st of ch, ch 3, turn.

3rd Row. Sl st in 1st loop, * ch 2, sl st in next loop, repeat from * twice, ch 2, sl st in same space (an increase), ch 3, turn.

4th Row. Sl st in 1st loop, * ch 2, sl st in next loop, repeat from * 3 times, ch 2, sl st in same space (6 loops), ch 3, turn.

5th Row. Sl st in 1st loop, * ch 2, sl st in next loop, repeat from * 4 times, ch 3, turn. Repeat the 5th row 14 times.

Next Row. Skip 1st loop, sl st in next loop, * ch 2, sl st in next loop, repeat from * 3 times, ch 3, turn. Repeat the last row 3 times, having 1 less loop in each row.

Next Row. Sl st in next loop, ch 2, sl st in next loop, working down side of petal, * ch 2, sc in next loop, repeat from * down side to loop before the d c row, ch 4, sc in 1st st of starting ch, ch 4, working up opposite side, sc in next loop, * ch 2, sc in next loop, repeat from * up side and across top of petal.

Next Row. Ch 3, sc in same space, * ch 3, sc in next loop, ch 3, sc in same space, repeat from * all around, cut thread. Cut a 5 inch length of white covered wire and run through center of petal on back, turn over about ½ inch at top to hold in position. Sew wire at lower edge of petal and let remainder of wire extend at lower edge of petal. Work another large petal in same manner.

SMALL PETAL: Ch 4, 2 dc in 4th st from hook, ch 3, turn.

2nd Row. S c in next d c, ch 2, sc in 3rd st of ch, ch 3, turn.

3rd Row. Sl st in 1st loop, ch 2, sl st in next loop, ch 3, turn.

4th Row. Sl st in 1st loop, ch 2, sl st in next loop, ch 2, sl st in same loop, ch 3, turn.

5th Row. Sl st in 1st loop, * ch 2, sl st in next loop, repeat from * once, ch 2, sl st in same loop, ch 3, turn.

6th Row. Sl st in 1st loop, * ch 2, sl st in next loop, repeat from * twice, ch 3, turn. Repeat the last row 11 times.

Next 2 Rows. Decrease 1 loop at beginning of each row same as on large petal, ch 3, turn.

Next 2 Rows. Work even, ch 3, turn.

Next Row. Decrease 1 loop at beginning of row, ch 3, turn, sc in remaining loop, working down side of petal, * ch 3, sc in next loop, repeat from * down side, ch 3, sc in 1st loop of opposite side, * ch 3, sc in next loop, repeat from * up opposite side, ch 3, sc in 1st loop at

top of petal, cut thread. Lace a wire through back of petal same as on large petal. Work 2 more small petals in same manner.

TUBE PETAL: Ch 5, join to form a ring, * ch 3, sc in ring, repeat from * 3 times, do not join this or the following rounds.

2nd Round. * Ch 2, sl st in next loop, ch 2, sl st in same loop, repeat from * all around.

3rd Round. * Ch 2, sl st in next loop, repeat from * all around.

4th Round. Same as 3rd round. 3th Round. Working in same manner increase 3 loops evenly spaced, then work even same as 3rd round until piece measures about 1½ inches in length, ch 3, turn.

Next 2 Rows. Sl st in 1st loop, * ch 2, sl st in next loop, repeat from * 6 times, ch 3, turn.

Next 3 Rows. Decrease 1 loop at beginning of each row, ch 3 to turn each row.

Next Row. Same as last row but do not turn. Next Row. Working around entire opening, * ch 3, sc in next loop, ch 3, sc in same loop, repeat from * all around, join, cut thread. Tint the inside of petal with crayon having Yellow at center and Purple at top.

PISTIL: Ch 3, 6 sc in 3rd st from hook, without joining rounds work 1 sc in each sc until piece measures about 1½ inches, ** decrease in next 2 sts (to decrease: * insert hook in next st, pull loop through, repeat from * once, thread over and pull through all loops at one time), repeat from ** twice, cut thread leaving a small length (top of pistil), with hook pull thread through inside of pistil. Tint outside with Yellow pastel crayon. Double the 8 inch length of medium wire in half and cover with Rayon for about a 1½ inch length at top and insert in crocheted pistil. Pull wire through tube petal and cover the stem of wire with a strip of Green crepe paper. Arrange petals as illustrated around the tube petal and cover all wires with a strip of Green crepe paper. Finish with artificial fern and a ribbon bow if desired.

Daisy Corsage



Materials Required: AMERICAN THREAD COMPANY "GEM" CROCHET COTTON, Article 35, size 30. "STAR" CROCHET COTTON, Article 20 or 30, size 30 1 ball each White and Yellow 3 artificial Leaves 3—6 inch strips of Wire Green Crepe Paper Steel crochet hook No. 12

DAISY; With Yellow, ch 5, join to form a ring, ch 3 and work 17 dc in ring, join, cut thread.

PETAL: With White, ch 14, insert hook in any dc, pull loop through, ch 1, 1 sc in next st of ch. 1 sdc in each of the next 3 sts, (sdc: thread over hook, insert in st, pull loop through, thread over and work off all loops at one time), 1 dc in each of the next 9 sts, 6 sdc in end st, working on opposite side of ch, 1 dc in each of the next sts, 1 sdc in each of the next 3 sts, 1 sc in next in same dc, cut thread. Work a petal in each remaining Work 2 more daisies in same manner. Cover each wire with $\frac{1}{2}$ inch strip of Green crepe paper. Sew center back of daisy to one end of wire. Tie together And attach leaves. Cover tied section with crepe paper.

Boutonnière



MATERIALS: J. & P. Coats Tatting-Crochet, Size 70: 1 ball each of No. 48 Hunter's Green, No. 8 Blue, No. 9 Yellow, No. 37 Dk. Lavender, No. 4 Pink, No. 1 White and No. 15-B Shaded Bright Reds, and J. & P. Coats or Clark's O.N.T. Pearl Cotton, Size 5: 1 ball of No. 48 Hunter's Green, or J. & P. Coats "Knit-Cro-Sheen": 1 ball of No. 48 Hunter's Green. Milwards Steel Crochet Hook No. 13. ¼ yard of millinery wire. Small safety pin.

WILD ROSE . . . Starting at center with Shaded Bright Reds, ch 6. Join with sl st to form ring. 1st rnd: (Sc in ring, ch 5) 5 times. Join with sl st to first sc.

FIRST PETAL . . . 1st row: 6 sc in next loop. Ch 3, turn.

2nd row: DC in first sc, 2 dc in each sc across. Ch 1, turn.

3rd row: Sc in each dc across and in top of turning chain. Ch 3, turn.

4th row: Skip first sc, dc in next 2 sc, 2 dc in each sc across to within last 3 sc, dc in next 3 sc. Ch 1, turn.

5th and 6th rows: Repeat 3rd and 4th rows.

7th row: Repeat 3rd row.

8th row: Skip first sc, holding back on hook the last loop of each dc, make dc in next 5 sc, thread over and draw through all loops on hook,

thus working off 6 dc as 1 dc, dc in each sc across to within last 6 sc, work off 6 dc as 1 dc as before. Ch 1, turn.

9th row: Sc in each dc across, working off first 3 sc and last 3 sc as 1 sc. Ch 3, turn.

10th row: Skip first sc, work off next 4 dc as 1 dc, dc in each sc across to within last 5 sc, work off next 5 dc as 1 dc. Break off. Attach thread to next loop and work as for First Petal. Make 3 more petals in same way.

STAMENS . . . Starting at base with Yellow, ch 9, * thread over, insert hook in 3rd ch from hook and draw loop through, (thread over, insert hook in -same place and draw loop through) twice; thread over and draw through all loops on hook, ch 5, sl st in first ch made, ch 8. Repeat from * once more, thread over, insert hook in 3rd ch from hook and draw loop through, (thread over, insert hook in same place and draw loop through) twice; thread over and draw through all loops on hook, ch 5, sl st in first ch made. Break off. Sew Stamens in place.

STAR OF BETHLEHEM . . . Starting at center with White ch 2.

1st rnd: 5 sc in 2nd ch from hook. Join.

2nd rnd: Sc in each sc around. Join.

3rd rnd: Sc in first sc, * ch 10, sl st in 2nd ch from hook, sc in next ch, half dc in next ch, dc in next 3 ch, half dc in next ch, sc in next ch, sl st in next ch, sc in next sc. Repeat from * around. Join and break off.

CENTER . . . With Yellow, ch 6. Join with sl st to form ring. 12 sc in ring. Join and break off. Sew to flower. Make 1 Lavender, 1 Pink and 3 Yellow flowers in same way.

FORGET-ME-NOT . . . Starting at center with Blue, ch 8. Join with sl st to form ring.

FIRST PETAL . . . 1st row: 4 sc in ring. Ch 3, turn.

2nd row: Skip first sc, dc in next 3 sc. Ch 3, turn.

3rd row: Skip first dc, holding back on hook the last loop of each dc, make dc in next 2 dc and in top of turning chain, thread over and draw through all loops on hook (cluster made); ch 3, sl st in tip of cluster. Now, working along side of petal, (ch 3, sl st in base of next row) twice; sl st in ring. Make 4 more petals like this. Join and break off.

CENTER . . . Work as for Center of Star of Bethlehem. Sew to center of flower. Make 2 more Forget-me-nots in same way.

SMALL LEAF (Make 6) . . . Starting at long side with Hunter's Green, Size 70, ch 40. 1st row: Sl st in 2nd ch from hook, sc in next 6 ch, (ch 7, sl st in 2nd ch from hook, sc in next 5 ch, sl st in same place as last st on starting chain, sl st in next 4 ch) 3 times; sl st in each remaining ch across. Break off.

Attach thread between last 2 leaves on opposite side of starting chain, ch 7, sl st in 2nd ch from hook, sc in next 5 ch. Working along opposite side of starting chain, sl st in next 4 ch, ch 7, sl st in 2nd ch from hook, sc in next 5 ch, sl st in same ch on starting chain. Break off.

LARGE LEAF . . . Starting at center with Hunter's Green, Size 70, ch 15.

1st row: Sc in 2nd ch from hook, half dc in next ch, dc in next ch, tr in next 9 ch, dc in next ch, 5 half dc in next ch; working along opposite side of starting chain, make dc in next ch, tr in next 9 ch, dc in next ch, half dc in next ch, sc in next ch. Ch 3, turn.

2nd row: Skip first st, holding back on hook the last loop of each dc make dc in next 2 sts, thread over and draw through all loops on hook (1 dc decreased); (2 dc in next st, 1 dc increased—dc in next st) 5 times; 2 dc in each of next 5 sts, (dc in next st, 2 dc in next st) 5 times; dec 1 dc, dc in next st. Ch 3, turn.

3rd row: Skip first dc, dec 1 dc, dc in next dc, (2 dc in next dc, dc in next 2 dc) 5 times; 2 dc in each of next 6 dc, (dc in next 2 dc, 2 dc in next dc) 5 times; dc in next dc, dec 1 dc, dc in top of turning chain. Ch 3, turn.

4th row: Skip first dc, dec 1 dc, * dc in next 3 dc, 2 dc in next dc. Repeat from * across to within last 3 sts, dec 1 dc, dc in top of turning chain. Break off.

Cut 3 pieces of wire 3 inches long. Wind Green Pearl Cotton tightly around each wire. Sew 2 Small Leaves to each of the wires. Sew Small Flowers to Small Leaves. Sew Wild Rose and Large Leaf in place. Wind Green Pearl Cotton around all wires and fasten securely. Sew safety pin to back.
