Create a check list

Grab a great notebook

When you get your notebook also get supplies like high lighters, markers, pens and pencils, erasers and other things that make writing within it so much easier.

Look for discounts early in advance

Many stores offer Halloween stuff as soon as September. Some even offer things within the August. You can stock up on decorations at this time or you can start getting creative with craft supplies as well. Grabbing discounts on things like food items for your recipes can also come in handy. Be sure to visit discount stores within your area to find cheap food and even cheaper decorations.

Remember that many things can be used more than one way. Don't limit yourself to just what it's front of your face instead, expand your imagination and see what the same item can be with a bit of imagination and thought.

Before you start shopping – also look for coupons online to see what else you might need that will be cheaper. You can also grab the newspaper to get more discounts as well. Pumpkins

Pumpkins are a huge part of Halloween because they are a symbol of fall and it's harvest. A lot of people assume that if you buy a pumpkin you have to spend all day carving it and making a silly face on it. If you've never carved a pumpkin before it can take hours just to do a few elements. This is especially true if you don't have the right tools to make your pumpkin.

But the good thing is that there are tons of ways to add pumpkins to your home without having to crave them yourself or at all. One way is to get a strong person to do it for you. If you know the guy at the corner house is strong and has some great tools for cutting, ask him to make a face for you. If he's strong and/or if he has the tools needed it might take him a few minutes.

Another option is to buy them pre-carved. Some crafts stores provide those now because it really does save a person a lot of time. You can even ask the floral department if they will make some custom pumpkins for you. Be sure to have a design in mind when you are ordering and a picture of that design so they know what you are looking for. This will cost money but normally it's worth it.

Lastly, another option is to paint your pumpkin instead of carving it. Let's be honest, craving a pumpkin is really gross. The seeds, the flesh and all other things within the pumpkin are hard at times and just plain gross. Taking a paint brush and some pretty fall colors with some glitter can be a great thing for your party. You can also use the pumpkin to create non pumpkin faces such as monsters, witches, fairies and everything else you can thing of. All those creatures can be made by carving or by not craving the choice really is yours.

Candles

A lot of people forget the scents of the holiday because normally candles are used in the winter. The truth is the fall scent of pumpkin or even gingerbread can really invite people into your home to stay for a longer period of time. Getting candles is very easy and many times you can grab only two or three and be done with it. Make sure the scent is long lasting by testing it before your party. Determine which scent works the best with the food you are serving. The last thing you want is your candle over powering the smell of cooking food and thus making the food taste almost like the candle it self. Because of that element, try to limit the amount of candles that is next your food. You can still add candles around your food but instead of scented ones, go for the basic non scented instead to keep the light the same but the scent gone from your area.

Serving Bowls

You will need a lot of snacks so making sure that you have 5 to 10 serving bowls is a must. So many

times people forget the element of just general snacks like chips, dip and candy also need a special place on your table. You can get really creative with your serving bowls by adding silly elements, funny looking toys within the bowl and other things as well. Use a range of sizes and make sure that they also match as well. You will also need a creative punchbowl. Instead of going with a scary looking punch bowl, go for a scary (but tasty) punch instead. Get super fun by making your punch glow or adding silly things like eye balls inside of it to make people giggle as they serve themselves.

Something Scary

Of course a Halloween party has to have an element of fear in it. This doesn't mean you scare people all the time it means you might have something pop out at them and gets a scream and laugh in response. The main elements of Halloween are fear so it's okay to get a good laugh in.

Many times people use themselves to add the scarey element to their party. They might dress up in a crazy outfit or they might enter the home in a completely different way. But you aren't limited to only those elements. Instead, you can add surprises in every room of your party or you can have crazy music playing in certain areas as well.

Don't forget things like fog machines and recreating scenes from horror movies. The design ideas are truly limited because it's all about how creative you are and how you happy you are able to make your guest.

Whatever scary thing you add, make sure that you make it scary for a few minutes and silly for the rest. The last thing you want is parents calling you the next day saying "your scary element" made their kids have nightmares. It should be a surprise element that will make someone laugh right after being scared!

Just like the scary element, you need something silly as well. And no, these things can not be the same elements. It's true that you want your scary element to turn into something silly, it's not the same thing for your silly element.

It can be a figurine or maybe it's how you serve your food or maybe it's within one of your games. The idea is to have fun with it. Go for something both silly and cute and you should be fine.

decoration and it can make a huge difference. Just because the item is small doesn't mean people aren't going to notice them.

Things like figurines, small little things that make your tables look amazing, small little things that outline where to walk and how to get to the main things. You can use simple old fashion labels to name your experiments and then place the actual name of the dip on the bottom of the name. This will add a cute element and something unique as well as feed your guest. Just make sure you make more than one jar for each dip. There are tons of unique ways to serve food, don't be limited to what you can find online instead look in magazines and in books as well. You can also look at things that aren't for Halloween and use them to give you more ideas on how to show case your food. Things like boxes, or tins or anything else can

be great as well.

Food

Be sure to keep your songs PG-13 if you have children there or even have their own kid music playing in a room just for them.

Games and laughter

Games are so important for all parties these days. It's true that many people still play games at parties . But the truth is , when you play games at parties it because a memory unlike any other. There is a long list of games in the game file that will be perfect for any Halloween party. Plus within the package — I've included a few printable games you can play with both kids and adults. Just pick out two to four games from the list and go from there. Gather the supplies and then have a ton of fun playing the game. With games comes laughter. The biggest caution is to make sure the laughter isn't teasing. No one wants or needs to get their feelings hurt at your party. Make sure you note who might be super sensitive (kids for example) and who might be very aggressive within the game itself.

Haunted house

Halloween haunted houses are so much fun and allow you to be super creative as well. You can have a super scary haunted house that would only be for adults. A haunted house for adults might cost more money than one for children because it's much harder to scare an adult than it is to a children. Just be sure you keep in mind the children can get nightmares. Make sure you combine scary with funny to avoid a child from getting overly scared and never wanting to come back.

Games



Games are so important when it comes to creating a great Halloween party. The games below will allow you to have a good time while being able to help your guest have just a good a time as well. It's important to keep in mind the age of your guests and the games they can play. Dividing the games and allowing your guest to choose which games they want to play and where.

Raffles

Holding raffles are so much fun because they allow you to hand out tickets to everyone who comes into your party and then just wait until the end of the party to pick a winner. The biggest element of your raffle will be your prize. You want people to want to stay for your raffle to end. The prize you choose to give should be something fun and something your guest will love. If you have children as your party, consider holding two raffles one for kids and another for adults. There are a list of prize options on the next chapter.

Board games

Board games are tons of fun because there are tons of choose from. You can offer group games or even games for 4 to 6 players as well. The choices are limitless and can allow you to place two to three board games all over your home to fill all your guest gaming needs. It's not recommended that you offer prizes for those that win board games. It can get expensive quickly. It would be cheaper just to offer little goodie bags of candy to those all playing the game instead. Goodie bags normally only cost \$1 to \$2 to make and can be a nice treat to hand out as you see a few people having fun while playing Scrabble or even The Game of Life.

Bingo

All types of bingo is fun but what makes Halloween bingo even more fun is that it's simple and easy to do. Plus it's a group game. I've included a bingo game for you to print out. You get a good selection of cards that allow you to customize them as needed. You have two play options: You can have your guest enter the words within each square and search for those items around the home. Or you can place the words inside the boxes yourself. Make sure that with either version you keep the rules in the same area you have the game supplies at. If you play a bingo game – make sure that you offer a prize as well. The bingo game is based on words instead of images to save you some ink instead of making you use a ton of ink. Be sure to buy enough pens and to place them in all areas of the house next to game cards. You can also play traditional bingo which will require much more focus but is just as fun.

Costume contest

With Halloween comes costumes of course and with costumes you have to have some great prizes for your contest. The prize for your raffle and your costume contest should be either worth the same or similar. Have a costume contest for all three types of guest (kids, men and women) at your party and then a main over all winner.

The key to a successful costume contest is to let your other guest vote. Print out voting sheets and make sure to note that people can not pick themselves because that would be cheating. All you have to do is have a few jars to take the sheets and keep them safe. You should announce the winner of the costume contest at the same time you do the raffle.

Apple bobbing

When it comes to Halloween apple bobbing is a normal thing for the fall because apples are in season and it's a game fun for everyone. Parents love it because it's silly and it promotes healthy eating and kids love it because it allows you to get wet and have some fun in a large group of people.

Remember it's an outdoor game and requires a large amount of water, apples and a large item to hold both elements. Make sure to get good ribbon to hold the person's arms.

Pinata

Pinata's in a party are amazing and fun and Halloween parties could use that element of fun. Depending on the size of your party you might need more than one pinata and make them two different ones instead of all the same thing. Have a set area for both pinatas and place a label on the pinata that states when it will be time to hit it.

Trivia

Trivia is fun also because it allows you to interact with people. Creating a trivia game is a lot of fun but can take a bit of time. You have to make it short but still challenging. I've included a list of 30 questions and answers that you can use to build your own trivia quiz for your guest. To make the game more fun add a time limit to allows your guest to play for a short amount of time and then move on to the next game. Your questions can be anything from candy to history to even about movies and songs. There really is no limit to the things you can place into your trivia game.

Scramble words

Scramble games are wonderful as well. To create your own scramble word games all you do is go online and search for a Halloween word list. Once you've found your list – you then need to find a software that can scramble the words for you. The best option is

Keep the games short by having the game timed. Remember your words don't have to be Halloween themed instead you can create word list about candies or costumes or even movie titles. It can be anything!

Remember, you don't need to give actual prizes for the board games instead go with goodie bags instead. Don't go over board with prizes, consider the amount of games, the length of the party and how many people might be showing up.

Food

Yum, who isn't going to love getting free food after winning something fun? Go with something yummy like a fruit cake that is decorated in a spooky way. You can also go for a pretty collection of cupcakes or even something like a complete main dish of food. Make sure the item you bake or buy is easy to make Halloween themed and something nearly all your guest will like.

Gift cards

Gift cards are a ton of fun because it's like money in card form. People enjoy all different types of gift cards so don't feel limited to just the normal. Go for gift cards that are all the same worth instead of changing them up. This would only apply for one single game. If you'd like to give only gift cards out – then go with a range of prices and a range of products.

Electronics

Things that people enjoy within the electronics area is nearly unlimited. You can give away CD's, Ipods and so many other things. The biggest issue is that you must keep your cost low and consider how many winners you might have and thus how many prizes you'd have to buy as well. Keep things simple by visiting discount stores and seeing what else you can buy as well.

Something handmade

Handmade things you can give your guest as a prize include the following, Tshirts, Art, Hats, Stuff Animals, Paper Stuff, Jewelry, Home décor and even bath and body items. There are tons of handmade

things you can find all over the internet. Just be creative and set a budget for each item. Keep things simple and stick with what you like the most and what you think your guest will like as well. The best places to look for handmade items are craft fairs and online websites such as etsy.com.

Money

Of course money has to be on the list of great prizes. Giving money as a prize is always fun for your guest. Make sure to write out how much every games grand prize would be somewhere where people can see it. The last thing you want is a ton of people asking you throughout the party about the cash prizes.

Goodie Bags

Goodie bags are easy and fun. You can also get super creative with them. They don't have to be the cheap plastic ones instead, you can go with bigger bags with more stuff inside of them. Unlimited things can be added to your goodie bags. The best part of a goodie bag is that while the bag should be Halloween themed the items inside don"t have to be. You can fill your bag with candy, pencils, pens, paper, figurines, small pieces of art and everything possible. Go for things that match your theme colors to save some money. You don't have to buy those \$3 Halloween candies when the red candies are only 50cents!

Costumes

Halloween is all about costumes so of course we have to talk costumes and consider some things that people wonder about costumes and Halloween parties.

Why you must dress up

Dressing up is just part of your party and super important. Make sure your costume fits your party and also makes your guest comfortable. The last thing you want is to scare your guest especially if they are children. Instead keep your costume neutral if you are having a party with a wide range of ages.

You can find costumes everywhere. Online and within your home town it's completely possible to find what ever kind of costume you might want. Turn it into a potluck

Potlucks mean that you don't have to cook as much food as you normally have to. If you plan on turning your Halloween party into a potluck, you need to write that note in your invitation so that your guests will know in advance. Set a theme for the actual party

Simply go online and do a search, buy one of the "gigs" and request your piece of art. Make sure that before you contact an artist that you know just what kind of picture you are looking for . If you have examples then that would be perfect as well.

Give your guest favors to play with while partying

These favors don't have to be expensive, instead you can go cheap and still provide your guest with something fun to play with. For example, let's say your party is very dark, providing glow sticks to each guest as they walk in will help them see everything and enjoy the fun as well. Other favors include stickers for children and small themed toys. Your favors should not be candy.

Add food coloring and sugar to food to add spooky colors

Sometimes you want to make a basic dish that you know your family will love but you don't want it to look so normal and not Halloween themed. So here's how to add that spooky color to your food. You mix sugar with food coloring then stir it into your food. The reason you have to add sugar to the food coloring directly is because food coloring normally has a very bad flavor, you are able to tone down

that gross flavor by adding something sweet too it. Make sure you add more sugar then food coloring to keep the flavors mellow as well. You'd be shocked to know that even with the sugar – normally the recipe will taste the same. If you aren't a fan of sugar, any white item will work will. Make sure the flavor is light and easy to dissolve within your recipe.

Have fun at your party

One thing that so many people forget about hosting a party is that it can be stressful. Because of all the elements within your Halloween party – it's normally super stressful. The best way to remove that stress is to remember it's a party. Don't consider the party work even though it might seem like that for awhile. Be sure to add some fun and relaxation to your party. You shouldn't be running around doing things during the whole party instead have fun, sit down and chat with your guest and spend time even playing some great games.
